ten pine trees then & there growing of the value of
ten dollars and other wrongs to the said Rebecca Hens-
berger then & there did against the peace and
dignity of the Commonwealth and to the well ex-
ample of all others in like case offending.

This information is filed
by the directions of the Court
on the presentment made
by the grand jury, which present-
ment was made in the presence
of David McCarty a witness sworn
out by the grand jury.
