



The Commonwealth of Virginia to the Sheriff

it doth appear by a presentment made  
at The Circuit Court held for The  
County aforesaid in The month of October  
1828 by the Grand Inquest of The said  
County that heretofore to wit on the  
1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1828 at the County aforesaid  
and within the Jurisdiction of said Court  
Charles Freeze & David Freeze with force  
and arms one Turkey of the goods and  
chattels of John Sawink of the value of  
fifty cents feloniously did steal take  
and carry away. — There are therefore  
in the name of the Commonwealth to  
command you that you take the bodies  
of the said Charles Freeze & David  
Freeze & them so taken do convey to the  
Jail of your County there to be kept until  
discharged by due course of law and to be  
dealt with according to the act of assembly  
in such cases made and provided and this  
you shall in no wise omit Given under  
my hand & seal this 25<sup>th</sup> day of October  
1828 at the County aforesaid

Rockingham County To wit.

To any Constable the Sheriff of the Said county

Whereas David Freeze of the county Rockingham aforesaid (Lohocan) was this day committed to the Gaol of this county, by a Warrant of the Honorable Judge Smith of the Superior court in Said county at the last October term of Said court, under a presentment of the Grand Inquest of this county held during the said Superior court - for having feloniously taken stolen and carried away One Turkey of the Value of fifty cents, the property of John Swank of Said county (farmer) and having being duly notified by the Gaoler, that said David Freeze was committed to his Gaol ~~on the~~ <sup>Warrant</sup> aforesaid - it appearing to me, that the felonious offender whereunto he stands charged ought to be examined into by the county court: Therefore on behalf of the commonwealth I require you that you summon at least eight of your the Justices of your Said county to meet on ~~Saturday~~ <sup>Thursday</sup> the 18<sup>th</sup> day of this Instant (December) at the courthouse in Said county, and then and there to hold a court for the examination of the fact with which the Said David Freeze stands charged and for such other and purposes concerning the premises as is by law required and directed: and that you have then there this warrant:
