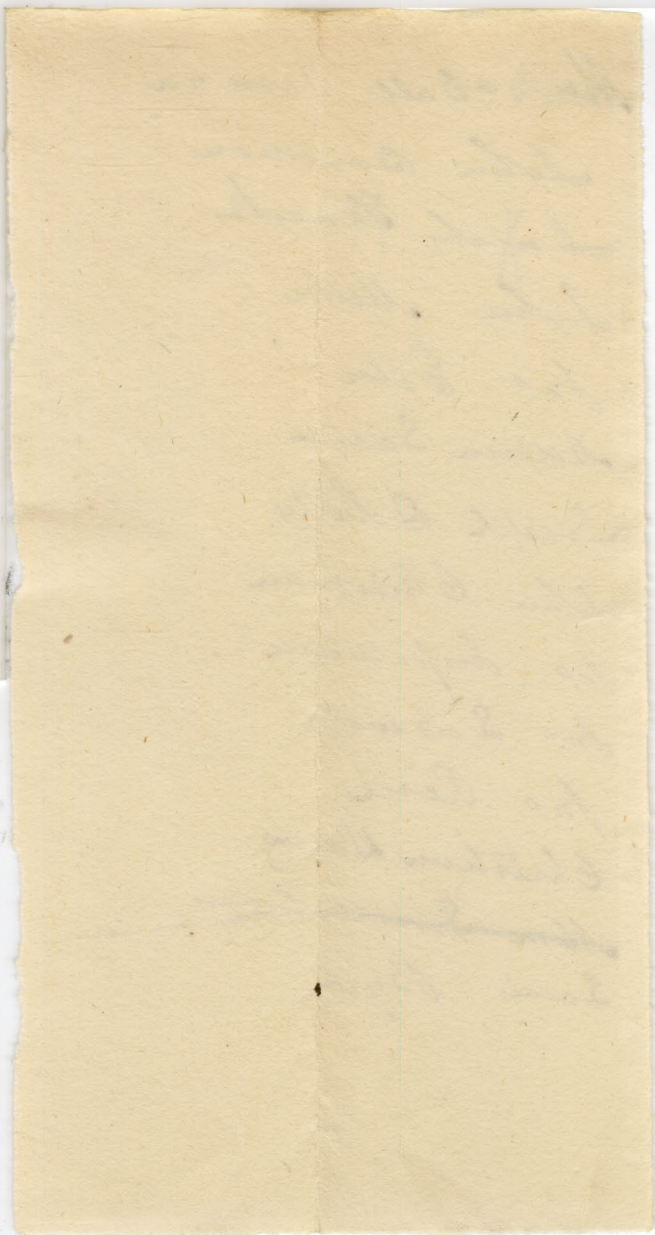

The Commissioners of Virginia to the Sheriff of Rockingham County greeting: We command you, that you cause to come, before the Judge of our Superior Court of Law for the said County, on the Monday before the third Tuesday in October next twelve good and lawfull freeholders of your County residing as near as may be to the place where the Burglary was committed of which Abraham McCall alias Abraham Purnpff is accused any one of whom is possessor of abisable estate real and personal of the value of three hundred Dollars at the least to recognize on their oaths, whether the aforesaid Abraham McCall alias Abraham Purnpff be guilty of the ~~foregoing~~ Burglary aforesaid or not, and have then there the names of the said freeholders and this writ, Witness My hand the Clerk of our said Court, at the Court house the 24th day of ^{September} ~~October~~ 1828, and in the 54th year of the South.
