

Rocky Mountain Territory

This day Austin Beckley personally appeared before me a Justice of the peace in & for said county & made oath, that he understood that he is prohibited in the Superior Court of Rocky Mountain Territory for horse-racing or for permitting his horse to run ^{in the public use}; he admits that he did permit his horse to run, but declares that he did not then know that it was unlawful & if he had so known he would not ^{have} permitted his horse to run. Given under my hand this 23rd October 1859

the *26th* day of *October* 1829 and in the *24* year of the Commonwealth.
