1<sup>st</sup> Count-

The jurors for the body of the County aforesaid on their oaths present that heretofore to wit on the ~~seventy~~<sup>twenty</sup> second day of February in the year eighteen hundred and thirty four at the County of Augusta in the Commonwealth of Virginia Madison Ham alias Madison McCawley with force and arms two Bank notes on one of the banks of Virginia, to wit on the Farmers Bank or on the Bank of Virginia, one a fifty dollar Bank note the other a ten dollar Bank note one twenty dollar Bank note upon the Bank of the Valley in Virginia, and two five dollar Bank notes, one on the Bank of Potomac in the district of Columbia and the other a five dollar Bank note upon a bank to the jurors unknown all of the value of ninety dollars lawful money of Virginia the property of Alexander R. Givens, then and there being found feloniously did steal & take and carry away. And the jurors aforesaid on their oaths <sup>present</sup> that the stealing aforesaid of the said Bank notes by the said Madison Ham alias Madison McCawley as aforesaid was an offence against the Laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia punishable by confinement in the public jail and Penitentiary house near the City of Richmond in the State of Virginia. And the jurors aforesaid on their oaths further present that the said Madison Ham alias Madison McCawley afterwards, to wit on the eleventh day of November eighteen hundred and thirty four at a Circuit-Superior Court of Law and Chancery held for said Augusta County at the Court House in said County was duly convicted of said offence, and the period of his confinement in the public jail and Penitentiary house was then and there ascertained and fixed by the jury by whom he was tried, at two years. And the jurors aforesaid on their oaths further present that afterwards to wit on the twenty third <sup>day</sup> of November eighteen hundred and thirty four at the County of Augusta at the Court house in said County, at the said  <sup>Circuit</sup> Superior Court of Law & Chancery held for said County the said Madison Ham alias Madison McCawley was sentenced for said offence to two years imprisonment in the aforesaid jail & Penitentiary house of the Commonwealth of Virginia, by said Court. And the jurors aforesaid <sup>on their oaths</sup> further present that afterwards and in pursuance of said conviction and sentence the said Madison Ham alias Madison McCawley was confined in said jail & Penitentiary house, but afterwards was at large having been pardoned, or having escaped or been <sup>otherwise</sup> discharged from confinement in said jail & Penitentiary house.

And the jurors aforesaid on their oaths <sup>present</sup> further present that after the said Madison Ham alias Madison McCawley was at large having escaped or been pardoned or otherwise discharged from confinement as aforesaid in said jail & Penitentiary house, to wit about the hour of one in the night of the ninth <sup>day</sup> of July in the year eighteen hundred and thirty seven at the Court



- by of Rockingham and within the jurisdiction of this Court, the said  
Madison Ham alias Madrier McCarty late of the County of Rockingham  
with force and arms at the County of Rockingham, the dwelling house of  
Oliver T Man (Tailor) then situate, feloniously and burglariously did  
break and enter with intent, the goods and chattels of Oliver T Man

ly and burglariously, to steal, take, and carry away, and then and there and with-  
in the jurisdiction of this Court with force and arms one frock coat of

dollars and one blue cloth waistcoat pattern of the value of three dollars  
one striped waistcoat pattern of the value of <sup>and one blue cloth waistcoat pattern of the value of two dollars</sup> four dollars of the goods & chattels  
of the said Oliver T Man in the said dwelling house then and there being  
found, then and there feloniously and burglariously did steal, take, and carry  
away against the statute in such case made and provided and against  
the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth.

2<sup>nd</sup> Count -

And the jurors aforesaid on their oath aforesaid further present - that Madison  
Ham alias Madrier McCarty late of the County of Rockingham on the ninth  
day of July eighteen hundred & thirty seven about the hour of one in the night  
of the same day with force and arms at the County aforesaid and within the  
jurisdiction of this Court, the dwelling house of Oliver T Man (Tailor)  
then situate, feloniously & burglariously did break & enter, with intent, the  
goods & chattels of Oliver T Man in the said dwelling house then and there  
being, then and there feloniously & burglariously to steal take & carry away  
and then & there with force and arms one frock coat of the value of ten  
dollars, one yard and a fourth of blue cloth of the value of five dollars  
two yards and three fourths of Casimere of the value of four dollars &  
one blue cloth waistcoat pattern of the value of three dollars and  
one striped waistcoat pattern of the value of four dollars & one blue  
cloth waistcoat pattern of the value of two dollars of the goods & chattels of  
the said Oliver T Man in the said dwelling house then and there being  
found, then and there feloniously and burglariously did steal, take, and  
carry away, against the statute in such case made & provided against  
the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth.

Be it remembered, that at this said Term, to-wit:

At a Superior Court of Law & Chancery held for  
the County of Augusta, at the Court house, on  
Monday the 11th day of Novr, in the Year 1834,  
John H. Moore Gentlemans, Foreman, & Wm Davis,  
Washington Swoope, Joseph Larew, Jacob Sease,  
Samuel Blackwood, Wm Brooks, John Knight,  
George C Robertson, Robt S Brooks, Jacob Naulcar,  
James S Bush, John Porterfield, Robert Guy, George  
M Cochran, Benj T Reed, David S Young, Alex P R  
Givens, Wm Ladd, John H Accison, Adam Smith, and  
David Bree, were sworn a Grand Jury of Inquest  
for the body of this County, and after having re-  
ceived their charge retired from the Bar to con-  
sider of their presentments and after some time  
returned into Court and made the following  
presentments, to-wit: "An Indictment against

Madison McAuley for Grand Larceny,  
Indictment "a True Bill" & an Indictment against the  
found "Said for Petit Larceny" a True Bill, which  
Indictment is in the words following  
to-wit: "

Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery  
for Augusta County &c."

The Jurors of the County  
sworn of and for the body of the County aforesaid  
upon their oaths present that Madison McAuley  
alias Madison Rand late of the said County, on the  
Twenty second day of February in the Year Eighteen  
hundred and thirty four at the County of Au-  
gusta and within the Jurisdiction of this Court  
with force and arms two Bank Notes and one of  
Banks of Virginia Note, and the Farmers Bank and



The Bank of Virginia, one a Fifty Dollar Bank Note,  
the other a Ten Dollar Bank Note, and Twenty Dol-  
lar Bank Note upon the Bank of the Valley in  
Virginia and two Five Dollar Bank Notes, one on  
the Bank of Potomac in the District of Columbia  
and the other a five Dollar Bank Note upon a  
Bank to the Surors unknown, all of the value of  
Ninety Dollars lawful money of Virginia, the  
property of Alexander P. Givens then and there  
being feloniously did steal, take & carry  
away, contrary to the form of the Statute in that  
case made and provided and against the  
peace and dignity of the Commonwealth.  
And at another day, to-wit:

At a Circuit Superior Cou-  
rt of Law and Chancery held for the said County  
of Augusta at the Court house, on Tuesday the 11th  
day of October 1834.

Verdict

That Madison McCauley alias Madison  
Haw late of the Parish of \_\_\_\_\_ in the County  
of Augusta, who stands indicted for Grand  
Larceny, was led to the Bar in custody of the Sher-  
iff of this Court, thereof arraigned and pleaded  
not Guilty to the Indictment, Whereupon came  
a Jury, to-wit: Alexander M. Austin, Jacob Coffman,  
Thomas A. Turk, Thomas Baskins, Charles Baskins,  
John Baskins, James Crawford, James C. Manp in,  
Robert M. White, William Eidsen, John Crawford,  
and Bailey Dunlap, who being elected, tried and  
sworn, the truth of and upon the premises to  
appear, upon their Oaths do say, that the said  
Madison McCauley alias Madison Haw, is guilty  
of the Larceny aforesaid, in manner and form  
as in the Indictment against him is alleged,  
and that the property stolen has been restored  
to the owner thereof, and they do ascertain the  
Term of Imprisonment of the said Madison McCauley



alias Han, in the Public Jail and Penitentiary House to be Two Years: And thereupon the Prisoner was remanded to Jail.

And now at this day, to wit: At a Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery held for the said County of Augusta, at the Court House, on Saturday the 23<sup>d</sup> day of Novr 1834.

Pronounced

Madison Melanly alias Madison Han, late of the Parish of \_\_\_\_\_ and County of Augusta who stands convicted of Grand Larceny, was again led to the Bar in custody of the Bailor of this Court, and thereupon it being demanded of him if any thing he had or knew to say, why the Court should not now proceed to pronounce Judgment against him according to Law, and nothing being offered or alleged in delay of Judgment. It is considered by the Court, that the said Madison Melanly alias Madison Han, be imprisoned in the Public Jail and Penitentiary House of this Commonwealth, for the Term of Two Years, the period by the Jury in their verdict ascertained, and that he be kept in a solitary Cell in said Jail and Penitentiary House, on low and coarse diet for the space of one Twelfth part of said Term. And it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County, do as soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court, remove and safely convey the said Madison Melanly alias Han from the Jail of this Court to the said Jail & Penitentiary House, therein to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner directed by Law. And the Court doth certify that on the Trial of the Prisoner nothing appeared to the Court either in aggravation or extenuation of the offence of the said Madison Melanly alias Han.
