against James Foul, Indictee in the Court before County  
Law & Pleas held for Rockingham County, for carrying away  
certain Slaves in said Independent Nation ~~that~~ <sup>that</sup> that  
after said Ten jurors have been removed from the  
Court House, And ~~placed~~ by ~~opponent~~ in a Room at  
the Tower of Bayonne Vaupell, And in the custody  
of ~~opponent~~, and two other Deputy Sheriffs, Sworn  
unto and timely to the best of his skill ~~to~~ <sup>to</sup> ~~to~~ <sup>and</sup> ~~and~~  
and ability to keep said jurors, and neither to  
speak to them themselves nor to suffer any other person  
to speak to them touching any matter relative to the  
trial aforesaid until they should return in the  
Court, on the following day - That about 9 O'clock  
at Night on the night of the 13th of October, John  
Miller who had been elected here and sworn  
as a juror for the trial of James Foul, and who  
had escaped from the jury Box, left the Court House  
and made his <sup>way</sup> ~~way~~ into the Country down 3 or  
4 Miles, and was attacked & dragg'd back, by two  
of the Deputy Sheriffs, as ~~opponent~~ understood, and put  
into the room, with the other jurors & kept and  
detained with said other jurors during the remainder  
of the night, and slept with one of them ~~for~~  
~~so soon may know this 16th of October 1844 to an~~  
~~opponent further states that he knew no connection~~  
~~between said Miller and the other jurors on the~~

subject of the test of Guicciardi, that effect does not  
keep in the body until the games on the night  
given under my hand this 16<sup>th</sup> October 1840.

This day Andrew Bulk Deputy Sheriff  
for Justice of the Peace & Sheriff of Rockingham County  
personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace  
in said said county and made oath that he was  
one of the Deputy Sheriffs who had charge of the  
Jury on the night of the 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup> of October  
1841 who had been elected by Juries drawn from  
and in the course of the month of said October  
had the above right or nine o'clock over night  
of the said 13<sup>th</sup> of October between twelve & one o'clock  
Hallowe'en eve, the Deputy Sheriff of said night  
Sheriff being John Miller who had on the said  
said 13<sup>th</sup> of October ~~assembled~~ and a foreman for  
the other jurors ~~as~~ escaped from the custody of the  
Sheriff in the same room with the other jurors  
and that he then said Justice remained with the  
said jurors about Miller in the said room  
from the time the said Miller who complained  
in said room until the morning of the 14<sup>th</sup>  
of October 1841 when he met them from the  
said room and separated from the said jurors  
and that he heard no conversation dur-  
ing all the time said Miller was in the  
said room between said Miller & the other  
or any of the other jurors the concerning the  
cause for which the said Justice was about being tried  
that said John Miller slept in the same bed with  
one of the jurors. He himself slept part of the  
night while said Miller was in said room  
jurors under my head this 16<sup>th</sup> of October 1841
