oath that he was one of the Deputy Sheriffs, sworn to take
into Custody Ten Jurors, all part of whom were elected thereon
and ^{for which were} known, to try an issue at the Suit of the Comynthe
against James Toole, Indicted in the Court before me
Law & Equity held for Rockingham County, for carrying away
certain Horses in said Independent Nation. That
after said Ten Jurors had been removed from the
Court House, and placed by appointment in a Room at
the Town of Bequinn Vassett, and in the Custody
of appointment, and two other Deputy Sheriffs, sworn
well and truly to the best of their Skill & ~~judgment~~
and ability to keep said Jurors, and not to
speak to them themselves nor to suffer any other person
to speak to them touching any matter relative to the
trial of said issue until they should return in the
Court, on the following day - That about 9 O'clock
at Night on the Night of the 13th of October, John
Miller who had been elected here and sworn
as a Juror for the trial of James Toole: and who
had escaped from the Jury Box, left the Court House
and made his way into the County some 3 or
4 Miles, and was arrested & Brought Back, by two
of the Deputy Sheriffs, as appointed understood, and put
into the Room, with the other Jurors & kept and
detained with said other Jurors during the remainder
of the Night, and slept with one of them ~~and~~
~~was not my house the 16th of October 1841~~ and
appointed further states that he knew no Connection
between said Miller and the other Jurors on the

Subject of the trial of James Tull, that effort did not
stop in the room until the papers on the night
given under my hand This 16th October 1841

On this day, Andrew B. Smith, County Sheriff
for the B. Hallam, Sheriff of Washington County
personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace
in and for said county and made oath that he was
one of the Deputy Sheriffs who had charge of the
jailers on the night of the 13th & 14th of October
1841 who had been elected by James Jacob for
said term in the case of the County vs. John for
said term; that about eight or nine O'clock P.M. morning
of the said 13th of October James Jacob & Jacob B.
Hallam were taken into custody by said Deputy
Sheriff John Miller who had on the said
said 13th of October escaped from a jailer from
the other jailers & escaped from the Deputy Sher-
iff, in the same room with the other jailers
and that he then said Jacob remained with the
said jailers & said Miller in the said room
from the time the said Miller was placed
in said room until the morning of the 14th
of October 1841. where he was taken from the
said room and reported from the said jail-
ers and that he heard no conversation dur-
ing all the time said Miller was in the
said room between said Miller & the other jail-
ers or any of the other jailers. He concerning the
case for which the said Jacob was about being tried
the said John Miller slept in the same room with
one of said jailers. He himself slept part of the
night while said Miller was in said room.
James Jacob was heard that 16th of October 1841
