Circuit-Sup Court of Law & Chancery for the County of
Rockingham County to wit:

The jurors for the body of the county aforesaid
on their oath present that heretofore to wit on
the day of _____ in the year 1842 at the County
aforesaid William Smith being the surveyor of
that part of the public road leading from the Spring
Branch road to the Dry River road near Muddy Creek
in the county aforesaid and within the jurisdiction
of this court, and designated as No. 2 in the road
book kept for the purpose of designating parcels
in the County of Rockingham, permitted a part of
the said road, to be and remain out of order in this,
that on the day and year aforesaid at the County
aforesaid the said William Smith being surveyor as
aforesaid did not cause the said part of the public
road to be kept well cleared and smoothed and
thirty feet wide, against the form ^{of the Statute} in such case
made and provided and against the peace and dignity
of the Commonwealth.
