Rockingham County to wit:

This day personally appeared before me at our county
assizes, a justice of the peace for said County, Andrew
Houch, and made oath to the following statement,
That at the present term of the Sup Court he has
been indicted for selling spirits, That he had on hand
during the past year a barrel of wine which he
had made himself & he purchased of a man in
this county a keg of wine of a similar kind, which
was also home-made wine. That he had license
to sell spirits, and though he knew he could not
lawfully sell intoxicating drinks, to be drunk at his
house, and did not do it; yet he was under the impres-
sion he could do so in regard to the wine, which
he had made himself, and which in fact was
less intoxicating than common cider. This was
the kind of wine which Taffling²⁰, who made
the indictment, and in these cases he had no
intention of violating the law, and was ignorant
that he was doing so.
