The jurors for the body of the County aforesaid, on their oath present, That heretofore, to wit on the second day of January, in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and forty six, at the County aforesaid, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, Richard Board, late of the County aforesaid, with force and arms, divers, to wit, three Bank notes of the Farmers Bank of Virginia, for the payment of divers sums of money, amounting in the whole to a large sum, to wit the sum of forty seven dollars, and of the value of forty seven dollars; and divers, to wit, two Bank notes of the Bank of Virginia, for the payment of divers sums of money, amounting in the whole to a large sum, to wit, the sum of twenty five dollars, of the value of twenty five dollars; and divers, to wit, two Bank notes of the Bank of the Valley for the payment of divers sums of money, amounting in the whole to a large sum, to wit, the sum of forty dollars, and of the value of forty dollars; and one Bank note of the Merchants and Mechanics Bank of Wheeling for the payment of a certain sum of money, to wit the sum of five dollars, and of the value of five dollars, of the monies, property, and effects of one Abraham Rankin, then and there being found, feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the form of the act of the General Assembly of Virginia, and against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

aforesaid or not; <sup>and</sup>; and have them there the name of the said  
stockholders, and this writ, witness Henry J. Campbell Clerk of our  
said Court, at the Court house the 18<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year  
1846, and in the 60<sup>th</sup> year of the Commonwealth
