present that heretofore Court on the day of in the year 1855 and from that day to  
the day of, to-wit for the space of in the County aforesaid <sup>Abraham Earman</sup> ~~Henry L. Earman~~  
Surveyor of precinct Precinct Number one on the County and public road called  
Harrisonburg & Shely's road which precinct begins at the Keppelton and was near  
the house of Samuel Shely Sen. in said County & ends at the Poor House & Smith road in  
in said County, did not as such Surveyor on that day and for all that time aforesaid, cause  
that part of said road to be kept cleared smoothed of rocks and of obstructions and of the  
necessary width, to wit of the width of thirty feet, well drained and otherwise  
in good order and secure from the falling of dead timber thereon, but did on that  
day and at that time and during other days and times, between that day and time and the  
finishing of this indictment and whilst he was Surveyor as aforesaid, suffer that part of  
the said road to be and to remain for a long space of time obstructed and in bad order  
and insecure from the falling of dead timber thereon to the great damage of all the good citizens  
of this Commonwealth passing that way against the peace and dignity of the  
Commonwealth of Virginia.

This Indictment is founded on the evidence of Augustine  
Armstrong a member of the grand Jury sworn in Court  
Sext before the grand Jury to you wherein
