

At a Court Summoned and held for the County of Rockingham at the Court-house thereof on Monday the 6th day of October 1856 for the examination of James Gentry a white person who stands charged with a felony by him committed in this that he did on the day of July 1856 in the County of Rockingham one bright sorrel horse and saddle and bridle of the price of one hundred and twenty dollars of the goods and chattels of David Looker feloniously did Steal take and carry away Present Mason Bare Jr. Wm & M Harris, Andrew Gent Houch (Daniel Smith & Samuel A Coffman) Justices

The prisoner was led to the bar in custody of the jailor of this Court and sundry witnesses being sworn and examined as well on behalf of the Commonwealth as on behalf of the prisoner and the Court upon mature deliberation are of opinion that there is probable cause to charge the prisoner with the offence aforesaid it is ordered that he be remanded for trial before the Circuit Court of this County on the first day of the next term thereof and thereupon the prisoner was remanded to jail

Be it remembered that on this day personally appeared in court David Looker, George Lawrence, Henry Lawrence & Shelton H. Lawrence and severally acknowledged themselves to owe and be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia each in the sum of \$100. to be levied of their respective goods chattels lands and tenements and for the use of the Commonwealth, yet upon this condition that the said David Looker George Lawrence, Henry Lawrence & Shelton H. Lawrence shall make their personal appearance before the Circuit of Rockingham County on the first day of the next term thereof then and there to give evidence on behalf of the Commonwealth against James Gentry charged with felony and not to depart thence without the leave of said Court

Whereas James Gentry has this day been committed
to the jail of the Said county by my warrant for a
felony by him committed in this that Said James
Gentry on the day of July 1806 in the Said county
one Bright Pearl Horse Bridle and Tacke of the price
of one hundred and twenty dollars of the Goods and
Bottles of the Said David Lotey feloniously did Steal
Take and carry away, and being of opinion that there
is sufficient cause for charging the James Gentry
with the Said offence I command you in the name of the
Commonwealth of Virginia to Summons at Least Eight
of the Justices of the Said county to meet at the courthouse
of the Said county on Monday the 6th day of October
1806 to hold Court for the Examination of the fact with
which the Said James Gentry stands charged and for such
other purposes concerning the premises as is by Law required
and you are commanded to have them and there this
Warrant and return how you have Executed the same.
