At a Court held for Rockingham County at the Court house there of
on Monday the 21st day of June 1858

George W Euteler who stands charged with a felony by him committed in this that he did on the 29th day of January 1858 in the County of Rockingham unlawfully, maliciously and feloniously stab N^o Sigler with intent to maim, disfigure, disable and kill him the said N^o Sigler this day appeared in Court, in pursuance to the recognizance entered into by him at the last term of this Court and many witnesses being sworn and examined and the Court upon mature deliberation are of opinion that a felony has been committed, and that there is probable cause to charge the prisoner therewith, and that he ought to be tried for said offence before the Circuit Court of Rockingham County, it is therefore ordered that he be remanded for trial before the said Circuit Court on the first day of the next term thereof, and on motion of the prisoner by Attorney he is admitted to give bail for his appearance before the said Circuit Court. The said George W Euteler in the sum of one thousand dollars and his securities in the like sum of one thousand dollars, and thereupon the said George W Euteler together with Zachariah Rains and John W Kaylor his securities (who justified as to their sufficiency) acknowledged themselves to owe and be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia the said George W Euteler in the sum of one thousand dollars and the said Zachariah Rains and John W Kaylor jointly in the like sum of one thousand dollars to be levied of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements and for the use of the Commonwealth yet upon this condition that the said George W Euteler shall make his personal appearance before the Circuit Court of Rockingham County on the first day of the next term thereof, then and there to answer an indictment to be preferred against him for the felony aforesaid, and not to depart thence without the leave of the said Court, then this recognizance to be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.


Be it remembered that on this 21st day of June in the year 1858, Andrew J Sigler and Albert G Sigler personally appeared in open Court and acknowledged themselves to owe and be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of five hundred dollars each to be levied of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements and for the use of the Commonwealth

yet upon this condition that the said Andrew J. Sigler and Albert G. Sigler shall make their personal appearance before the circuit judge of the circuit court of Rockingham County, then and there to give evidence on behalf of the Commonwealth against George W. Outslar, and not to depart thence without the leave of the said court, then this recognizance to be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

Be it remembered that on this 21st day of June 1858 in the year 1858 Wm S. Downes and Isaac J. Grove personally appeared in open court and acknowledged themselves to owe and be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of one hundred dollars each to be levied of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements and for the use of the Commonwealth, yet upon this condition that the said Wm S. Downes & Isaac J. Grove shall make their personal appearance before the judge of the circuit court of Rockingham County, on the first day of the next term thereof, then and there to give evidence on behalf of the Commonwealth against George W. Outslar, and not to depart thence without the leave of the said court, then this recognizance to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
