Stirling a Justice of the said County, at the said County, and each
of them separately and individually, and by and for himself, ac-
knowledge himself separately and individually to be indebted to the
Commonwealth of Virginia, in the sum of One hundred dollars,
lawful money of the United States, to be levied of each of their goods
and chattels, lands and tenements, to the use of the Common-
wealth, if the said Charles A. Turley and ^{and Jacob B. Braithwaite} William Sterring
shall make default in the performance of the condition
underwritten.

The condition of this recognizance is such
that if the above bound Charles A. Turley and ^{and Jacob B. Braithwaite} William Sterring
and every of them, shall personally appear before the County
Court of said County, on the first day of the next Term thereof,
to give evidence in behalf of the Commonwealth against George
W. Cassaday alias Black, who stands charged with felony
by him committed, in this, that he did on the 1st day of
September 1855, in said County, feloniously take, steal and
carry away one Bay Horse of the value of One hundred
dollars of the goods and chattels of William Sterring
and do not depart thence without the leave of said
Court, then this recognizance to be void, otherwise to remain
in full force and virtue.

he then and there received of the said Brook-
ing one Hundred dollars, and the said

of the said Newmy, but was by him
