Thereupon the prisoners by their counsel, elected to be tried separately  
and thereupon Henry Jones one of the prisoners was led to the bar in custody  
of the Sheriff, and survey, witnesses being sworn and examined touching  
the premises the Court upon mature deliberation are of opinion that there  
is probable cause to charge the said Henry Jones with the felony aforesaid  
it is therefore ordered that he be remanded for trial before the Circuit  
Court of Rockingham at the October term next thereof, and the prisoner  
thereupon moved the Court to admit him to give bail for his appearance  
before the said Circuit Court which motion the Court doth sustain, and  
it is ordered that he enter into a recognizance for his appearance in the  
sum of five hundred dollars for himself and the like sum of five  
hundred dollars for his security.

Be it remembered that Henry Jones, George Haynes & Franklin Rundle  
personally appeared in Court and acknowledged themselves to owe and  
be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia the said Henry Jones in  
the sum of five hundred dollars and the said George Haynes & Franklin  
Rundle jointly and severally in the like sum of five hundred dollars  
to be secured of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements  
and for the use of the Commonwealth. Yet upon this condition  
that the said Henry Jones shall make his personal appearance before  
the Circuit Court of this County on the first day of the next term thereof  
to answer an indictment then and there to be preferred against him for  
felony, and not to depart thence without the leave of the said Court  
then this recognizance to be void, otherwise to remain in full force & virtue.

Elm Michael and other of the said prisoners, was led to the bar in custody  
of the Sheriff, and after hearing the evidence and argument of counsel, upon  
mature deliberation the Court are of opinion that there is probable cause  
to charge the prisoner with the felony aforesaid, it is therefore ordered  
that he be remanded for trial before the Circuit Court of this County  
at the next term thereof, and on the motion of the prisoner, he is  
admitted to give bail for his personal appearance before the said  
Circuit Court, to answer an indictment then and there to be preferred  
against him for the felony aforesaid, the Court doth sustain the said



motion and fix the amount of his bail at five hundred dollars and the like sum of \$500. for his securities

Be it remembered that Wm Michael, George Hoynes, David Michael and Allen Morris personally appeared in court and severally acknowledged themselves to owe and be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia the said Wm Michael in the sum of five hundred dollars and the said George Hoynes David Michael & Allen Morris jointly and severally in the like sum of five hundred dollars to be levied of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements and for the use of the Commonwealth Yet upon this condition that the said Wm Michael shall make his personal appearance before the Circuit Court of this County on the first day of the next term thereof to answer an indictment then and there to be preferred against him for felony and not to depart thence without the leave of the said Court then this recognizance to be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue

Depositions of witnesses taken before us Asher Argabright, <sup>Wm. Zapprey</sup> & Charles R. Rush, justices of said County.

Ezekiel Crawford being sworn testified as follows: They came before midnight - he - Crawford - had not gone to sleep, though he had gone to bed. Having heard the cow bells ringing, and the rails a-flying he got up to see what was the matter. Before he got out of the house, Isaac, his son <sup>in-law</sup> and Ludy, his wife, had gotten out into the yard, and before he, Ezekiel, got out of the house he heard the report of the gun at the time Isaac was shot, and just as he got in the door he saw the flash of the gun when Ludy, his wife, was shot. He heard them pulling down the spring-house and another small log house near the spring house. They then came into the yard and pulled down the kitchen. They threatened to pull down the house he lived in, if he did not move out of it before the next Tuesday night, and said they would kill them and destroy their property. He recognized Franklin Harman, Henry Jones and Wm. Michael as the three persons who were in the yard.

Interrogatories propounded by the prisoners, through Franklin Harman, to the witness, Ezekiel Crawford.  
Question. What time do you go to bed?

Answer. Whenever I get ready - I have no clock.

Question. Was it eleven o'clock when you went to bed on that night?

Answer. It was <sup>not</sup> eleven when I went to bed.

Question. How long had you been in bed before you heard the noise which caused you to get up?

Answer. Did not know how long, but had not gone to sleep.



Question. Had you a good pine Torch?

Answer. I had one good enough to see by.

Question. Are you well acquainted with Henry Jones  
Wm Michael and myself?

Answer. Certainly I am acquainted.

Question. Why could you not be able to tell which  
one helped to carry the property out of the  
kitchen?

Answer. I did not notice which one it was.

Question.

Isaac Crawford testified as follows:

He was first aroused by the barking of his dogs, got up  
and went out and found the dogs fighting, and then he  
went back to bed. As soon almost as he had gotten  
back to bed, his wife got up and went out and  
then came back and told him, Isaac, to get up  
for there were some persons out there - he then  
got up and went out, and found that some persons  
were pulling down the hen house. He then asked  
them, "What the devil are you doing there?" when  
Henry Jones replied, "By God, Crawford, I will  
show you in a minute or two." and then <sup>trus</sup> shot him. <sup>Crawford.</sup>

Crawford then told his Mother-in-law - Judy Crawford -  
to run, and then Jones shot her. Isaac Crawford and  
his Mother-in-law then went into the house. Isaac  
Crawford recognized Henry Jones, Franklin Harman  
and Wm Michael by sight as well as by the voice.

It was Saturday night, <sup>test</sup> a little before midnight.

Questions by the Prisoners.

Question. When did this affair happen?

Answer. On last Saturday night.

Question. What month?

I don't know what month.



Question. What year?

Answer. I don't know.

Question. How far were <sup>you</sup> off when you were shot?

Answer. About ten steps.

Question. Did you have a pin light?

Answer. No Sir.

Question. Were you shot with a shot gun or pistol?

Answer. Don't know whether shot gun or pistol -  
it carried shot.

Question. Whereabouts are you shot?

Answer. In the leg and rim of the belly.

Question. How did you know who shot you at that  
distance?

Answer. I could ~~see~~ <sup>see</sup> him as well in a moonshine  
night as in the day time.
