Rockingham, and now attending the said Court, upon their oaths present, that

Jacob B. Brattman on the 19th day of
March in the year 1840 in the said County, was the Sergeant
of a certain Corporation in the said County known
as "The Mayor, Council and Citizens of the Town of Harrison-
burg" legally authorized and duly qualified to
discharge the duties of the said office and was
then and there - to wit on the day and year
aforesaid within the limits of the said Corpora-
tion - in the due and lawful discharge of his
duty as Sergeant aforesaid - and that William E
Webster - did attempt then & there by force and threats
to impede the said officer in the discharge of his
duty aforesaid against the peace and dignity of
the Commonwealth of Virginia And the person
aforesaid upon these acts aforesaid do further present
that William E Webster on the day and year aforesaid
in the said County of Rockingham an assault
did make - upon one Jacob B. Brattman and him
the said Jacob B. Brattman did then and there beat
wound and threaten until his life was greatly
endangered against the peace and dignity of the
Commonwealth of Virginia

This indictment is found upon the
acts of Jacob B. Brattman a return sworn in
Court and sent upon the Grand jury (D)
for evidence


Rockingham County to Wit:

Be it remembered, that on this 20th. day of March 1860 William E. Webster and Robert A. Gray of the said County, personally appeared, before me Isaac Hardesty a Justice of the said County, and severally and respectively acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in the manner and form following, that is to say: The said William E Webster in the sum of one hundred dollars, good and lawful money of the United States, and the said Robert A. Gray in the sum of one hundred dollars, of good and lawful money, to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattles, lands and tenements, to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia, if the said William E Webster shall make default in the performance of the underwritten Condition.

The condition of the above recognizance is such, that if the above bound William E. Webster do and shall personally appear on the first day of next Circuit Court to be held for the County of Rockingham, at the Court house thereof, and then and there answer a bill of indictment, to be preferred to the grand jury in and for the said County, against him the said William E. Webster, for a misdemeanor by him committed for unlawfully resisting and assaulting Jacob R Brathwaite Sergeant of the Town of Harrisonburg while in the discharge of his duty, whereof the said William E. Webster stands charged and shall not then depart without leave of the said Court, then this recognizance shall be void and of no effect, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue

To the Sheriff of Rockingham County, Greeting,

Whereas, at a Circuit Court held for the County of Rockingham at the Court house thereof, on the 16th day of October 1860, a Jury having been impannelled and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined, between us and William E. Webster, late of the County aforesaid, on a certain Indictment, before that time found against the said William E. Webster for an Assault & Battery and impeding an officer in the discharge of his duty, and having heard the evidence, upon their oath did say that the said William E. Webster was guilty in manner and form as in the said indictment against him was alleged; and they assessed his fine to thirty dollars and ^{to be} imprisoned,

Therefore, we command you, that you do not omit for any liberty in your bailiwick, but that you take the said William E. Webster, if he be found within the same, and him safely keep, so that you have his body before the Judge of our said Circuit Court of Rockingham County, at the Court house thereof ~~on Thursday the~~ 18th day of the present month immediately, to shew, if any thing for himself he hath or knows to say, why the said Court should not then and there proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law; and further to do, submit to, and receive what our said Court then and there of him in this part shall consider.
