THE JURORS OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA, in and for the body of the County of Rockingham, and now attending the said Court, upon their oath present: That *Francis Menander* -

on the *6th* day of *Sept* in the year 1857, at - *the home of her husband*
where she resides in the said County of Rockingham, did sell by retail, wine, rum, brandy, whiskey, and other ardent spirits, and a mixture thereof, to be drank at the said place where sold, without being licensed to keep an ordinary at such place, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

AND THE JURORS AFORESAID, on their oath aforesaid, do further present: That *Francis Menander* -
on the day and year aforesaid, at *her residence* in the said County of Rockingham, did sell by retail wine, rum, brandy whiskey, and other ardent spirits, and a mixture thereof, without having paid the additional tax prescribed by law for the privilege so to do, and without having first obtained from the County Court of said County a certificate that he is a person of good character, and the Court sees no objection to such permission being granted, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This Indictment is found on the evidence of *Alexander McPurley* a witness sworn in Court and sent to the Grand Jury to give evidence.
