Be it remembered that on this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of September in the year 1855 William Swanson and J. S. Ducknall personally came before me J. L. Seibert Mayor of town of Harrisonburg and <sup>ex officio</sup> Justice of peace in and for said Corporation and generally and reputationly acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the manner and form following - To wit - The said William Swanson in the sum of one hundred dollars and the said J. S. Ducknall in the sum of one hundred dollars to be respectively made and used of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements for the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia - if the said William Swanson shall make default in the performance of the conditions hereinafter annexed - To wit

The conditions of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound William Swanson do and shall personally appear at the following grand jury term of the County Court for said County at the Court house thereof for said County and then and there answer a bill of indictment to be preferred to the Grand Jury in and for the said County against him the said William Swanson for a misdemeanor by him committed for unlawfully stealing taking and carrying away one carriage with the value of three dollars of the goods and

Chattel of A. P. ~~Boyd~~ Boude - Whereof the said  
William Swanson stands charged - This the above  
recognition shall be void and of no effect  
otherwise to remain in full force and virtue  
taken and acknowledged before me J. G.  
Libert the day and year first above written.

said complaint and be forthwith dealt  
with according to Law hereunto  
my hand this 27<sup>th</sup> day of Sept 1865
