of said County, personally came before me J. L. Siler
Mayor of the Town of Harrisonburg in said County,
and mutually acknowledged themselves to be indebted
to the Commonwealth of Virginia, as follows. The
said John Haney in the sum of one hundred dol
lars and the said Milly Spangler in the sum
of one hundred dollars, to be respectively bound
of their goods and chattels lands and tenements
to the use of the said Commonwealth of the said
John Haney shall make default in the perform
ance of the underwritten condition.

The condition of the above Recognizance is such, that
if the above named John Haney do and shall personally
appear before the County Court of Ruttenham
on the first day of the next Term of said Court, at
which there may be a grand jury, then and there
to answer a Bill of Indictment to be preferred to
the Grand jury in and for the said County against
him the said John Haney for Petit Larceny, when of
the said John Haney stands charged, and shall
not thence depart without the leave of said Court,
then the above Recognizance shall be void.
