

The Commonwealth of Virginia.

To the Sheriff of Rockingham County, Greeting:

Peter Greyer having this day been presented by the Grand Jury, sworn and empannelled for the said county, in the Circuit Court thereof, for that he on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 1865, in the county aforesaid, did feloniously break and enter a house, situate in the county aforesaid, with intent feloniously to take and steal therefrom six hundred pounds of tobacco, of the value of six hundred dollars, of the goods and chattels of Philip Pharis.

You are therefore hereby commanded to arrest the said Peter Greyer, and carry him before a justice of the said county, to be examined and tried by the said justice for the offence aforesaid according to law. And you are hereby further commanded to summon Philip Pharis, the witness on whose information the aforesaid presentment was made, to appear and testify in the premises before the said justice.

Witness Richard Parker, Judge of the Sixth Judicial District, now holding the Circuit Court of said county of Rockingham, at the Court House of said county, the 11<sup>th</sup> day of September 1865, and in the 90<sup>th</sup> year of the Commonwealth.
