Berry, J. W. Winsborough, Jno. B. Scott, Jno. F. Bradburn, James Royer and Isaac Ritenour, shall make default in the performance of the condition under written.

The condition of this recognizance, is such, that if the above bound J. H. Berry, J. W. Winsborough, Jno. B. Scott, Jno. F. Bradburn, Jas. Royer & Isaac Ritenour and every of them shall personally appear before the County Court of said County, on Friday next, the 8th day of September, 1865, to give evidence in behalf of the Commonwealth against Anderson Shiflett and Asa Shiflett, who stand charged with feloniously stealing and secreting the goods of Isaac Ritenour & others, and do not depart thence without the leave of the said Court,


