And the Jurors aforesaid, on their oath aforesaid, do further present: That *the said John McQuaid* on the day and year aforesaid, at *the Bar Room of the American Hotel* in the said County of *Rockingham* did sell by retail wine, rum, brandy, whiskey, and other ardent spirits, and a mixture thereof, without having paid the additional tax prescribed by law for the privilege so to do, and without having first obtained from the County Court of said County a certificate that he is a sober person of good character, and the Court sees no objection to such permission being granted, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.
