Roller a Justice of the said county and severally and jointly acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in manner and form following that is to say the said Romannus Painter in the sum of Fifty Dollars good and lawful money of the United States and the said Abraham Painter in the sum of Fifty Dollars of like good and lawful money to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and Chattels lands and tenement to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia if the said Romannus Painter shall make default in performance of the condition underwritten.

The condition of the above recognizance is such that whereas Adam M. May who stood bound as the bail of the above bound Romannus Painter for his appearance before the County Court of Rockingham at February Court 1867 on the first day of the term thereof to answer the Commonwealth's bill of indictment to be preferred to the Grand Jury in and for said County against him the said Romannus Painter for a misdemeanor by him committed for unlawfully taking and carrying away a load of twenty four Bushels of Corn the property of Jonathan Sulister whereof the said Romannus Painter stands charged has this day taken the body of the said Romannus Painter and surrendered him before me P. S. Roller a Justice of the said County in discharge of his said Recognizance and whereas the above bound Abraham Painter has undertaken before me as Justice aforesaid as surety of the said Romannus Painter for his appearance at the Court aforesaid on the first day of the February term 1867 to answer the Commonwealth for the Indictment aforesaid and that the said Romannus Painter will not then depart from the said Court without the leave of the Court Now if the said Romannus Painter does and shall personally appear before the Court on the first day of the term in February 1867 to answer the Commonwealth for the misdemeanor aforesaid whereof he stands charged and shall not then depart without leave of the said Court then the above recognizance to be void otherwise to remain in full force and Virtue.

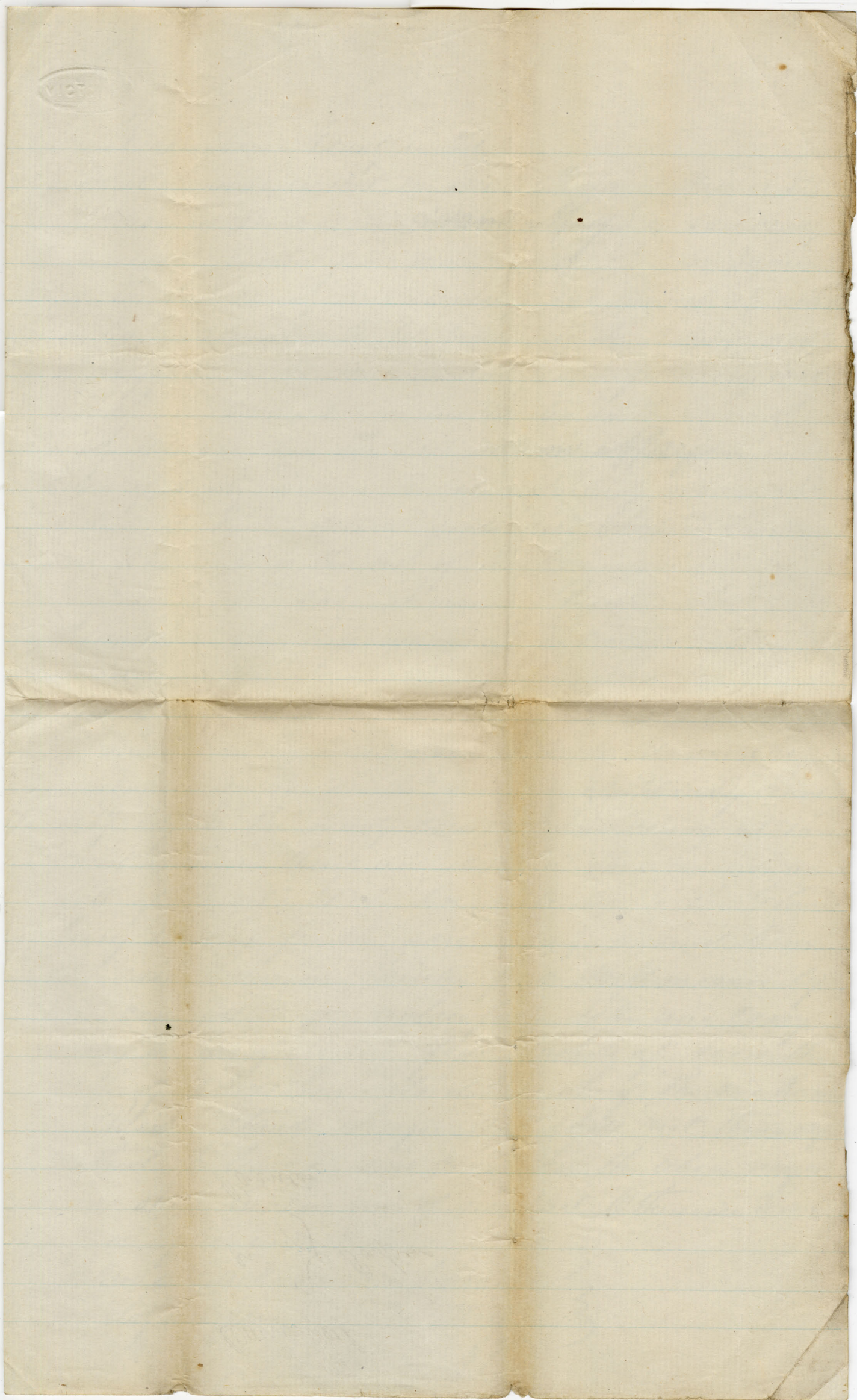
