December in the year 1855 in the said County, a church  
commonly called "Armstrongs Church" did unlawfully  
interrupt and disturb a certain assembly being  
then and there met for the worship of God  
against the peace and dignity of the  
Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found upon the  
evidence of Wm. H. Edwards, merchant, David Mott  
and Jas. C. Carl witnesses sworn in Court  
and sent to the Grand Jury to find evidence.
