tion, personally came before me
E L Liberty Mayor of Said Corporation
& before a Justice of the Peace
in for Said Corporation, and
severally and respectively acknowledged
themselves to be indebted to the Common-
wealth of Virginia in the manner
and form following That is to say
The S^d Jacob P. Effinger in the Sum
Fifty dollars and the Said D. Pennybacker
in the Sum of Fifty dollars,
The Said William Compton in the
Sum of Fifty dollar & The Said
John C Woodson in the Sum of
Fifty dollars, to be respectively
made and levied of their several
goods and chattels, lands & Tenements,
to the use of the Commonwealth of
Virginia, if the Said Jacob P Effinger
and William Compton shall make
default in the performance of the
underwritten Condition,
The Condition of the above recognizance
is such, that if the above bound
Jacob P Effinger & William Compton

do and shall personally appear
on the 19 day of August 1867
before the County Court of the said
County, at the Court house thereof
and there and there answer
a bill of indictment, to be preferred
to the Grand Jury in and for said
County, against them the said
Jacob P. Effinger, ~~and~~ and the
said William Compton for a
Misdemeanor by them committed
for unlawfully ^{assaulting} beating each other
with fist, and a cane, or stick,
whereof the sd. J. P. Effinger and
William Compton stands charged,
and shall ^{not} thence depart without leave
of said Court, then the above
~~Obligation~~ recognizance shall be void
and of no effect, otherwise to
remain in full force and virtue,
taken and acknowledged
before me the day & year
first above written.

tion has made information and complaint
upon oath before me J. L. Sibley Mayor
and Enos F. a Justice of the Peace
in said Corporation that said J. P.
Effinger and William Compton
did commit a breach of the peace
and assault and battery upon
each other in said Corporation
and in the County of Prockingham
on 18 day May 1867

These are therefore in the name of the
Commonwealth to command you
forthwith to apprehend and bring
before me or some Justice of the Peace
of Prockingham County the bodies
of the said J. P. Effinger and
William Compton to answer said
complaint and to be further dealt
with according to law given
under my hand and seal this
18 day of May 1867
