IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE SAID
COUNTY.

} THE Jurors of the Commonwealth of Vir-
ginia, in and for the body of the County of
Rockingham, and now attending the said Court, upon their oaths present, that

Robert Rodles on the day of
December in the year 1865 in the said County, at a Church

commonly called "Armentraut's Church" did wilfully,
interrupt and disturb a certain assembly
being then and there met for the worship of God, against
the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This Indictment is found upon the
evidence of Wm. Armentraut - Deac. Party and
John C. Carl witnesses sworn in Court
and sent to the Grand Jury to find evidence.

The Commonwealth of Virginia,

TO THE SHERIFF OF ROCKINGHAM COUNTY,—GREETING;

You are hereby commanded to summon

Robert Rodes

to appear before the Justices of the County Court of Rockingham, at the Court-house,
on the *third Monday* in *May* next, to answer an indictment
of the grand jury found at the February Term last. for disturbing
an assembly met for the worship of God.

And have then there this writ. Witness, *Littleton W. Gambill*, Clerk of our said
Court, at the Court-house, the *8th* day of *March* 1866, and in the *90th*
year of the Commonwealth.
