that William Saupley did on the 6<sup>th</sup>  
day of October 1866 in S<sup>d</sup> County  
wilfully interrupt and disturb an  
assembly of People then and then  
met for the <sup>public</sup> worship of God in a  
certain house there situated called  
Shady Grove Church by rude and  
indecent behavior and also by making  
a loud noise <sup>so near</sup> the S<sup>d</sup> Church ~~and also~~  
<sup>& also inside of a Church</sup>  
as to disturb the order and solemnity  
of the Meeting there are therefore in  
the name of the Commonwealth to  
Command you forthwith to

29<sup>th</sup> of September 1866  
The Justice of the Peace

Apprehend and bring before me  
or some other justice of the S<sup>d</sup> County  
The body of the S<sup>d</sup> William<sup>th</sup> Saufley  
to answer S<sup>d</sup> Complaint and to

seal this the 7<sup>th</sup> day of October  
1867

Be it remembered that on this  
18<sup>th</sup> October 1867 W<sup>m</sup>. Saufley of George  
and W<sup>m</sup>. Saufley sen of said county person-  
ally appeared before me W<sup>m</sup>. S. Showalter  
a Justice of said county and severally &  
respectively acknowledged themselves to  
be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia  
in the manner and form following that  
is to say the said W<sup>m</sup>. Saufley of George in  
the sum of twenty five dollars and the said  
W<sup>m</sup>. Saufley sen in the sum of twenty five  
dollars to be respectively made and levied  
of their several goods and chattels lands and  
tenements to the use of the Commonwealth

of Virginia if the said W<sup>m</sup>. Saufley of George  
shall make default <sup>in performance of the</sup> ~~of the~~ <sup>order written</sup>  
The conditions of the above Recognizance is  
such that if the above bound W<sup>m</sup>. Saufley  
of George do and shall personally appear on  
the first day of the Feb<sup>r</sup> term 1868 before the County  
Court of the said county at the Courthouse  
there of and then and there answer a bill  
of indictment to be preferred to the grand  
jury and for the said county against him  
the said W<sup>m</sup>. Saufley of George for a misde-  
meanor by him committed fore willfully  
and unlawfully disturbing an assembly met  
for the worship of god <sup>at Spradys Grove church</sup> whereof the said W<sup>m</sup>.  
Saufley of George stands charged and shall  
not there depart without the leave of said  
court then the above recognizance shall be  
void and of no effect

Otherwise to remain in full force and  
virtue
