Naylor in the sum of one thousand & fifty dollars of like good & lawful money, to be respectively made & levied of their several goods & chattels, lands & tenements to the use of the Commonwealth of Va., if the said George Naylor shall make default in performance of the condition underwritten

The Condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound George Naylor do & shall personally appear before the County Court of Rockingham on the second day of the next term thereof (Tuesday 19th) then & there to answer the Commonwealth for & concerning a certain felony by him committed, in feloniously & with malice killing James Hutz, wherewith the said George Naylor stands charged, & shall not depart therefrom without the leave of the ^{said} Court, then the above recognizance shall be void else to remain in full force & virtue

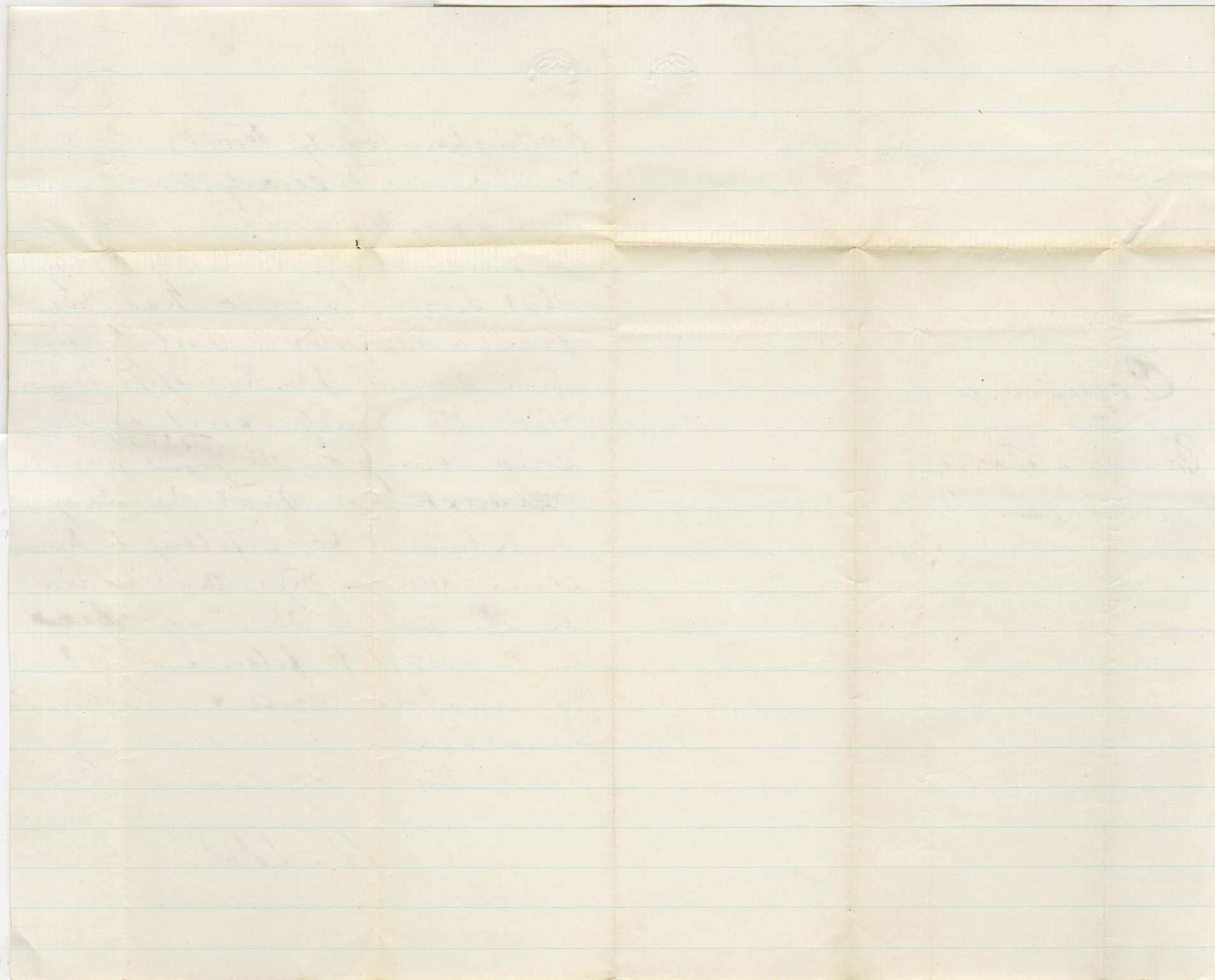

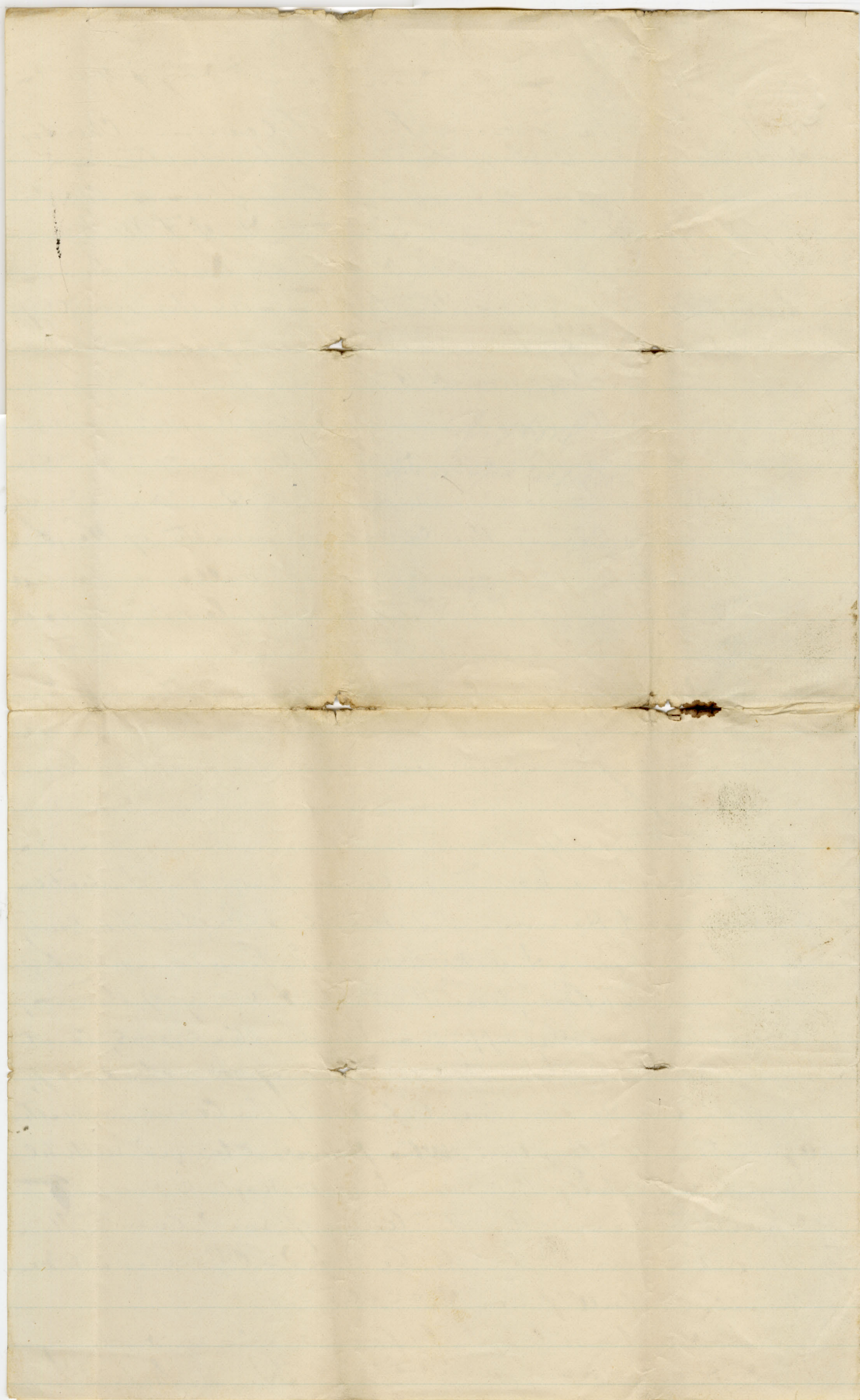
