These are, therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to apprehend and bring before me, or some *other justice* of said Town, the body of the said *James Cook* to answer said complaint, and to be further dealt with according to law.

James Cook and John A. Hill  
of the said town came before me J. D.  
Price a Justice of the peace of the said town  
and severally acknowledged themselves,  
to owe to the Commonwealth of Virginia  
in the manner and form following  
that is to say the said James Cook the  
sum of four hundred dollars and the said John A. Hill  
in the sum of four hundred dollars to be respectively  
made and service of their several goods and Chattels, lands  
and tenements to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia  
if the said James Cook shall make default in the performan-  
ce of the underwritten condition

The condition of the above recognizance is such  
that if the ~~above~~ above bound James Cook do and shall  
personally appear on the 5th day of July 1869 before the Court of  
Hustings for said town at the Court House thereof and then  
and there answer a bill of indictment to be preferred to the grand  
jury in and for said town against him the said James Cook  
for a misdemeanor by him committed, for unlawfully assaulting and  
cutting slaying and wounding with intent to Maim disfigure and  
disable one Samuel Garner whereof the said James Cook stands  
charged and shall not thence depart without the leave of said  
Court then the above recognizance shall be void and of no effect  
otherwise to remain in full force and virtue

Rockingham County, to wit:

I Saml Garner  
of the Town of Harrisonburg and County  
of Rockingham do hereby acknowledge  
that I have rec<sup>d</sup> from James Cook full  
and complete satisfaction for an assault  
and battery committed vs me on the 26<sup>th</sup>  
day of April 1869 & therefore ask and the  
petition the the Mayor the said Corporation  
acting as justice to supersede the said  
recognizance & discharge the said James Cook  
Saml Garner  
by Counsel  
June 23<sup>rd</sup> 1869.

Town of Harrisonburg State of Virginia to wit  
Whereas I Josb Price a Justice of the Peace Town on the 26<sup>th</sup>  
day of April 1869 took the recognizance of James Cook himself  
in the sum of three hundred dollars with P. H. Hill his surety in  
like sum. Conditioned for the personal appearance of the said  
James Cook before the ~~Circuit~~ jury of the Court of  
Hustings of said Town on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of July 1869  
it being the first day of the term there of to answer  
a bill of indictment to be preferred to the Grand  
Jury in and for said Town for Misdemeanor  
by him committed ~~him~~ on Saml Garner and  
Whereas, the said Saml Garner personally appeared  
before me this day and acknowledged in writing that  
he has received satisfaction for the said offence  
and all other injury he has sustained thereby  
And the said James Cook having paid all the  
costs that have accrued upon the said  
prosecution I do hereby discharge the said  
recognizance
