Libert, Mayor of said ^{Lower} Corporation, on this the 13th day of January 1868, and made complaint on oath that her husband the said Edward J. Sullivan did on the 12th day of January 1868, and frequently prior to that day, within the said ^{Lower} Corporation, beat, strike, kick, wound and bruise her; and that on the said 12th day of January 1868, and within the ^{Lower} Corporation aforesaid, did declare and threaten that he would beat her again, if she would go into her bed or sleeping room, by reason whereof she this complainant is afraid and has good cause to fear, that the said Edward J. Sullivan will do her some grievous bodily injury, and therefore prays that he may be required to give surety to keep the peace towards her. And the said Catharine Sullivan also says on oath that she does not make this complaint against the said Edward J. Sullivan, nor requires such surety from any hatred, malice or illwill, but merely for the preservation of her person from injury.
