

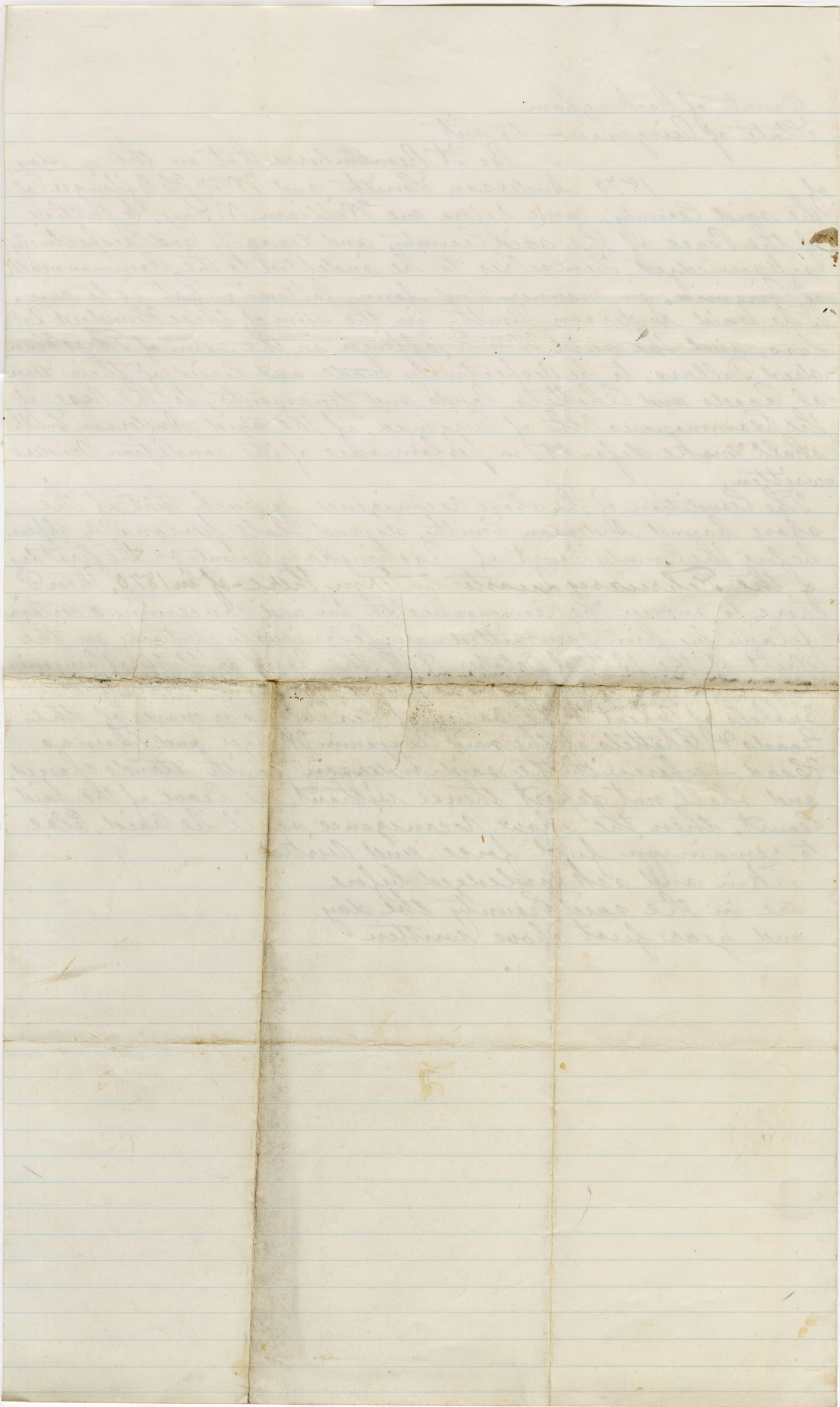

of 1870 Anderson Smith and Wm H Effinger of  
the said County, came before me William N. Gay, a Justice  
of the Peace of the said County, and severally and respectively  
acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth  
of Virginia, in manner and form following that is to say:  
The said Anderson Smith, in the sum of three Hundred Dol-  
lars, and the said Wm H Effinger in the sum of Three Hun-  
-dred Dollars, to be respectively made and levied of their sever-  
-al Goods and Chattels, lands and tenements, to the use of  
the Commonwealth of Virginia, if the said Anderson Smith  
shall make default in performance of the condition under-  
-written.

The Condition of the above Recognizance is such that if the  
above named Anderson Smith do and shall personally appear  
before the County Court of Rockingham County on the first day  
of the February Quarterly term thereof in 1870, then &  
there to answer the Commonwealth for and concerning a certain  
felony by him committed - in feloniously entering on the  
Night of the 13th of October 1869, the Barn or Stable of Benjamin  
Wanger in the County aforesaid and therefrom stealing Five  
Bushels of Wheat to the value of Six Dollars or more of the  
Goods & Chattels of the said Benjamin Wanger and Thomas  
Head, - wherewith the said Anderson Smith stands charged,  
and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said  
Court, then the above Recognizance shall be void, Else  
to remain in full force and virtue.
