ture thereof, to be drunk at the place where sold, without being licensed to keep an eating-house at
such place, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

AND THE JURORS AFORESAID, on their oath aforesaid do further present: That *A. G. Sigler*
in the town of Part Republic on the day and year aforesaid, at *his store room*
in the said County of Rockingham, did sell by retail wine,
ardent spirits, malt liquors, cider and a mixture thereof, without having first obtained from the County
Court of said County a certificate that his place of business is a convenient and suitable place for the
sale of liquors and that he is a sober person of good character, and without having obtained a license as
a liquor merchant to sell by retail wine, ardent spirits, malt liquors, cider, and a mixture thereof, against
the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This Indictment is found on the evidence of *S. R. Sterling, P. W. Strayer,*
a witness sworn in Court and sent to the Grand Jury to give evidence. *J. H. Wray,*
C. L. Hays,
J. Bateman,

the Court House.

Whereupon the Court overruled the motion of the defendant for a continuance of his cause until the next term, and required him to go into trial in the absence of these witnesses, to which action of the Court in overruling said motion requiring the defendant to go to trial, the defendant accepted and tendered this his first bill of exceptions which he prays may be signed, sealed and enrolled, and the same is done accordingly.

As it is remembered that upon the
trial of this cause, the defendant offered to prove by one
of the witnesses for the Commonwealth, and by sundry
other witnesses, that ~~as repeated~~ ^{to recd them} they had applied to the
defendant, for liquor, because having once kept a bar-
room it was supposed he was still in the business, and that
some of these applications were made for the relief of the sick,
and that none of these applicants got liquor from the defen-
dant, but the Court refused to permit such witnesses to be
introduced or to go to the jury, to which action of the Court
the defendant excepted, and prays that this his second
bill of exceptions may be signed, sealed and enrolled, and the
same is accordingly done.
