Hermal of the said County, personally came before me Jacob Hunkhouser, a Justice of the said County, and severally acknowledged themselves to owe to the Commonwealth of Virginia, that is to say, that said Sarah Clatterbuck, the sum of Twenty dollars, and the said Jacob J. Payne the sum of Ten dollars; and the said John F. Hermal the sum of Ten dollars, to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels, lands and tenements, if ~~the~~ the said Sarah Clatterbuck shall make default in the performance of the conditions underwritten.

The condition of the above recognizance is such, that if the above bound Sarah Clatterbuck shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth, and especially toward Archibald Fultz's family, for and during the term of Six months, from the day hereof, then this recognizance shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
