Justice of the said County and severally
acknowledged themselves to owe to the Common-
wealth of Virginia that is to say, the said
Albert McCauley the sum of Fifty-Dollars, and the
said Gar. S. McCauley the sum of Fifty-Dollars
to be respectively made and paid of their several
goods and chattels, lands and tenements, if he the
said Albert McCauley shall make default
in the performance of the condition underwritten.
The condition of the above recognizance is such,
that if the above bound Albert McCauley shall
keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all
the citizens of this Commonwealth, and especially
towards John Sprinkle for and during the term
of one year from the day hereof, then this recognizance
shall be void otherwise to remain in full force
and virtue.

John Sprinkle of the said County came personally before me A Argabright, Justice of the said County on this 26 day of August 1878 and made Complaint on Oath that Albert McCauley on the 23 day of August 1878 in the said County did and threaten that he would beat him on the first sight and wear him out on the earth by beating him. The said Complaint is afraid and has good cause to fear that the said Albert McCauley will do him some grievous bodily injury & therefore prays he may be required to give surety to keep the peace towards him. And the said John Sprinkle also on Oath that he does not make the Complaint against the said Albert McCauley nor does he give such surety from any hatred malice or ill will but merely for the preservation of his person from injury.

Forasmuch, as John Sprinkle, has this day complained on oath before me, A.
