December 1888 brought before me F. L. Woodson,
Mayor of the Town of Harrisonburg and
ex-officio a Justice of the Peace for said
County, upon a warrant, sworn out by Rosa
Wells, charging her the said Lucy Ward,
on the 27th day of December 1888, with feloniously
stealing, taking and carrying away one pair
of button shoes of the value of three dollars
and seventy five cents of the goods and
chattels of the said Rosa Wells, and was
by me found guilty of said offense, upon
the testimony of Rosa Wells, Margaret Briggs,
Samuel Williams & Maggie Johnson; and I
thereupon adjudged and ordered that the said
Lucy Ward, for the said offense, be confined
in the County Jail of Rockingham County
for the period of fifteen days. There are
therefore in the name of the Commonwealth to
command you the said Chief of Police forth-
with to convey and deliver into the custody
of the said Jailor the body of the said Lucy
Ward; and you the Keeper of the said Jail
are hereby required to receive the said Lucy

Hurd into the custody of the Jailor of Rockingham County

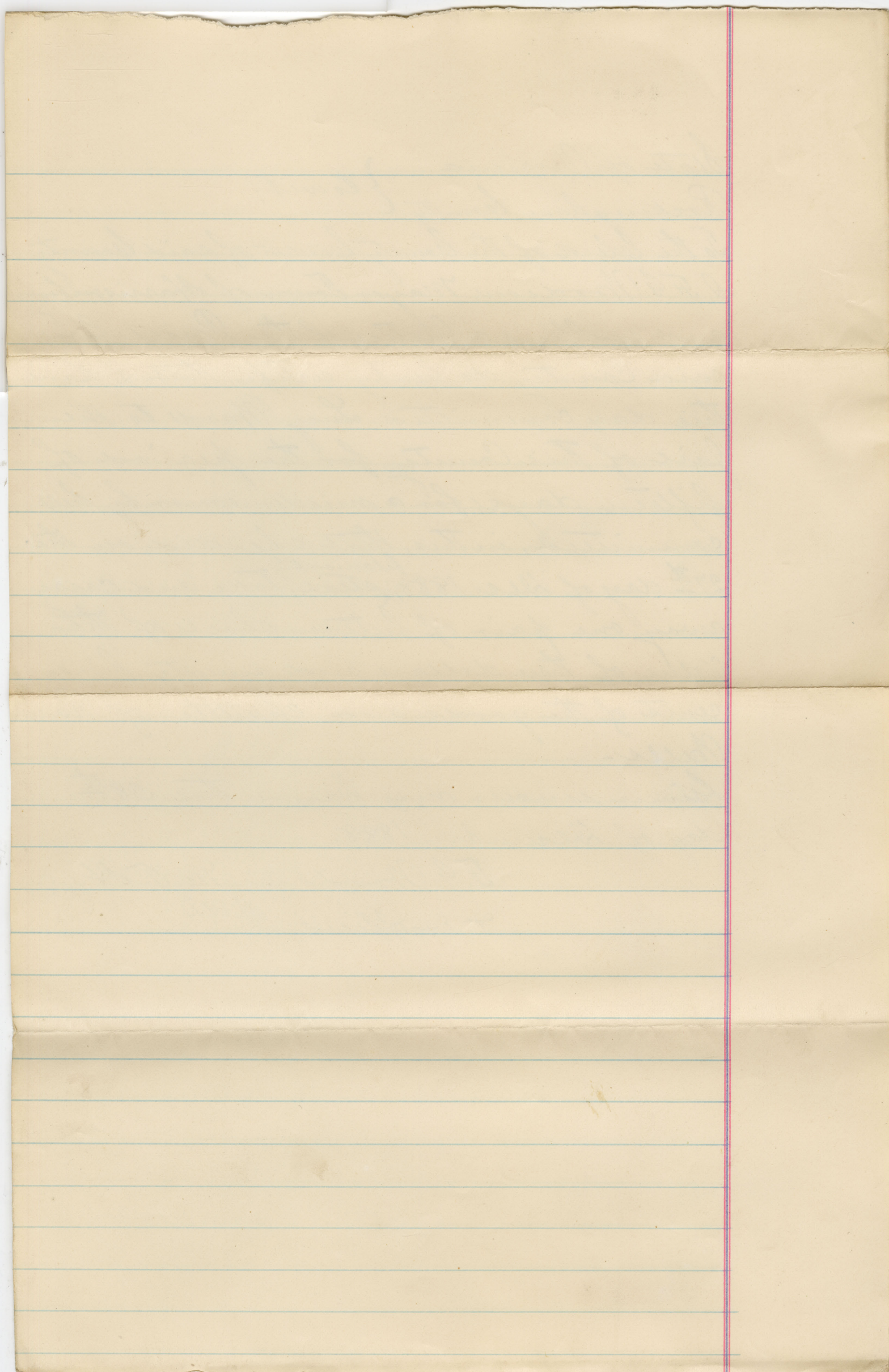

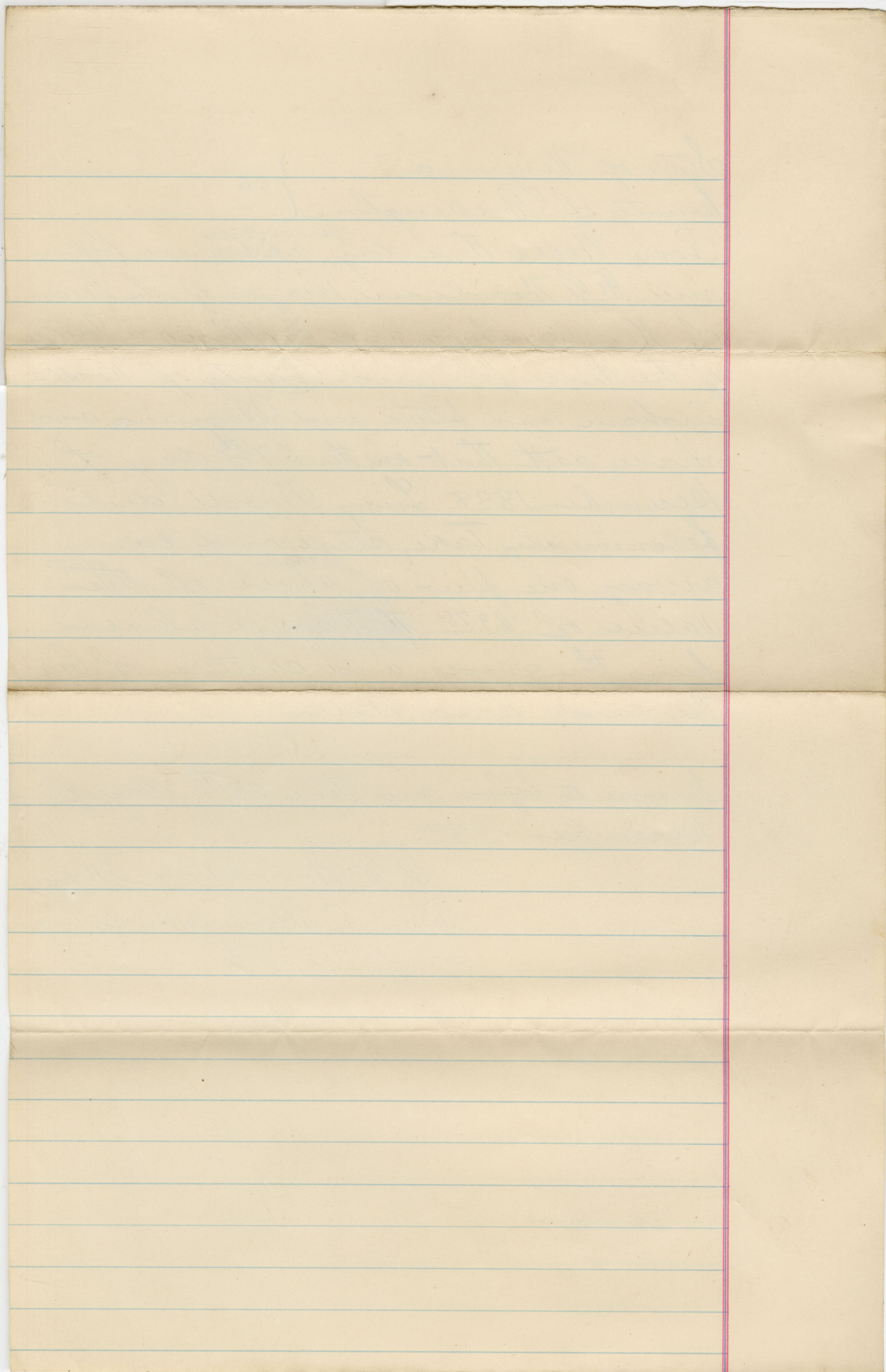
