In the County Court of the said County -

The Jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of the County of Rockingham, and now attending the said Court - Upon their oath present, that Mary Coleman on the 17th day of June in the year 1889 in the said County, divers notes of United States Currency, the exact value, number, and denomination to the Grand Jurors unknown, and divers ^{pieces of} silver coin, current money in this Commonwealth, the exact value number and denomination to the Grand Jurors unknown, the said notes of United States Currency and the said pieces of silver coin however amounting to the sum of One hundred and thirty eight dollars and of the value of One hundred and thirty eight dollars, of the goods and chattels, money, property, coin, & notes of one Joseph Jackson, then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal take and carry away against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia -

This indictment is found on the testimony of Joseph Jackson, J. V. Kavanaugh, Leo J. Wise, & Thomas E. Grim witnesses sworn in court and sent before the Grand Jury to give evidence -
