The Jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of the County of Rockingham and now attending the said Court - Upon their oath present, that Henry Morris on the day of July in the year 1889 in the said County did unlawfully, but not feloniously, injure and destroy certain personal property not his own, but the property of one Jacob Kyger - in this that he the said Henry Morris then & there did unlawfully, but not feloniously, shoot and injure one horse belonging to the said Jacob Kyger of the value of One hundred and twenty five Dollars, from the effect of which said shot and injury the said horse on the day of July 1889 in the said County did against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia -

This indictment is found on the testimony of Richard Morris and Jacob Kyger witnesses sworn in Court and sent before the Grand Jury to give evidence -

To Jm. J. Downs Special Constable of said
County, County, and to the Keeper of the Jail of said county.

These are
to command you the said Constable in the name of The
Commonwealth of Virginia forthwith to convey and deliver
into the custody of the Keeper of said jail, together with this
warrant, the body of Henry Morris, charged before me
W. D. Maiden a justice of the said county on the oath
of Richard Morris and others ^{with} a Misdemeanor or unlawful
Trespass by him committed, in this that the said Henry
Morris on or about the 13.th day of July 1889, in the said
County, did unlawfully shoot one horse of the value
of one hundred and twenty five dollars from the effect
of which, said horse died, being the property of
Jacob Reger. And you the said Keeper of the said
jail are hereby required to receive the said Henry
Morris into your jail and custody, that he may be
tried for the said Offense by the County Court of
the said County, and him there safely keep
until he shall be discharged by due course of
law. Given under my hand this 29.th day
of August 1889.
