present that William Landis ^{Daniel} on the 2^d of January in
the year 1889 on a Sunday at a place of worship
while a meeting for religious purposes was being held
at such place in the said County unlawfully did
carry about his person concealed from common
observation a certain dangerous weapon called
a pistol, without good and sufficient cause
therefor and against the peace and dignity
of the Commonwealth of Virginia -
This indictment is found on the testimony
of A. R. Blundell a witness sworn
in Court and sent before the Grand
Jury to give evidence -

We the Jury find the defendant William
Landes of Daniel guilty of Carrying ~~Concealed~~
~~weapons~~ a pistol about his person concealed
from common observation in manner and form
as charged in the indictment and assess
his fine at twenty dollars.
