Yancy*, not adjoining to or occupied with the dwelling-house of the said *William B. Yancy* there situated, in the day time of that day, feloniously did break and enter, with intent the goods and chattles of the said *William B. Yancy* <sup>*under the firm name of Yancy & Bros*</sup> ~~*during business*~~ in the said outhouse then and there being, feloniously to steal, take and carry away. And *a number of Knives, the number & value exactly to the Grand Jurors unknown, and a quantity of Candy and tobacco, the exact quantity and value to the Grand Jurors unknown, the said Knives, Candy & tobacco however in the whole of the value of Five Dollars* of the goods and chattles of the said *William B. Yancy* <sup>*during business under the firm name of Yancy & Bros*</sup> ~~*during business*~~ in the said outhouse, then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia. And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oath aforesaid, do further present, that *Newton Stagle* on the *17<sup>th</sup>* day of *August* in the year *1890*, in the said County, a certain outhouse, called a *Store House*, the property of one *William B. Yancy* <sup>*the firm name of Yancy & Bros*</sup> ~~*during business*~~ in the said outhouse then and there being found, then and there feloniously did steal, take and carry away, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found on the testimony of *Stewart M. Yancy, Albert S. Yancy* *& William B. Yancy* witness <sup>*as*</sup> sworn in Court and sent before the Grand Jury to give evidence.



We the Jury find the prisoner Newton Stagle guilty  
of breaking & entering the store house of Wm. H. Spencer  
with intent to commit larceny in manner and  
form as charged in the indictment and according  
the term of his imprisonment in the County Jail at ten  
months and the amount of his fine at five dollars

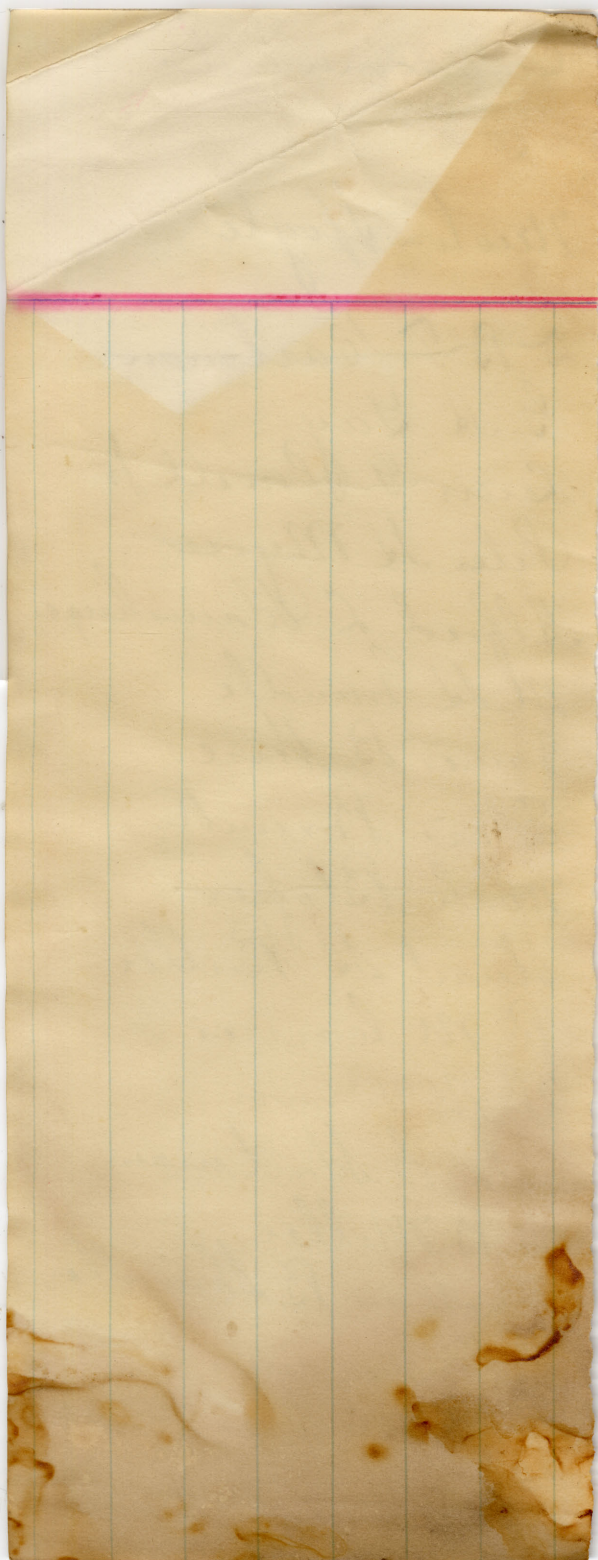






Rockingham Co to wit:

Yancey with the intent the goods and chattels of the said firm of Yancey & Bro in the said store house then & there to steal & that the said Hunt Stogle Knives Candy & tobacco of the value of five dollars of the goods & chattels of the said Yancey & Bro did feloniously take steal & carry away these are therefore in the name of the Commonwealth forthwith to apprehend & bring before me or some other justice of said County the body of the said Hunt Stogle to answer the said complaint and to be further dealt with according to law.
