Be it remembered that on this 25th day of February 1890
Enock Roach and Greenwood Elbaris & James Goodin
of the said County personally came before me W. D. McQuinn
a Justice of the said County and severally acknowledged
themselves to owe to the Commonwealth of Virginia
that is to say the said E. Roach the sum of Twenty five
Dollars - and the said Greenwood Elbaris the sum of
\$12⁵⁰/₁₀₀ Dollars and the said James Goodin the sum
of \$12²⁸/₁₀₀ Dollars to be respectively made and levied of
their several goods and chattels Lands & Tenements
if the said E. Roach shall make default in the
performance of the condition underwritten Each one
of the above bound party waiving the benefit of
their Homestead Exemption as to this obligation
The condition of the above Recognizance is such that
if the above bound E. Roach shall keep the Peace
and be of good behavior towards all the citizens of
this Commonwealth - and especially towards Mrs
Fanny Deegen for and during the term of six
months from the day hereof then this Recognizance
shall be void otherwise to remain in full force
and virtue
