The condition of the above recognizance is such, that
the above bound Richard Morris shall keep the peace
and be of good behavior towards all the citizens of
this Commonwealth, and especially towards David C.
Davis, for and during the term of one year,
from the day hereof, then this recognizance shall be
void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue
taken and acknowledged before me,
in the said County, the day and year
first above written
