If you find him not guilty - you will say so and no more - If you find guilty of breaking and entering in the day time, or of entering in the night-time without breaking, the dwelling house of Thomas Stogle with intent to commit larceny as charged in the indictment - you will say so and ^{you will therefore} ascertain the term of his confinement in the Penitentiary so that such term be not less than two nor more than ten years, or in your discretion confinement in the County Jail not exceeding twelve months and fine not exceeding five hundred dollars - If you find him not guilty of the felony aforesaid but guilty of Petit Larceny as charged in the indictment - you will say so, and then ascertain the term of his confinement in the County Jail so that such term be not less than fifteen days nor more than six months -
