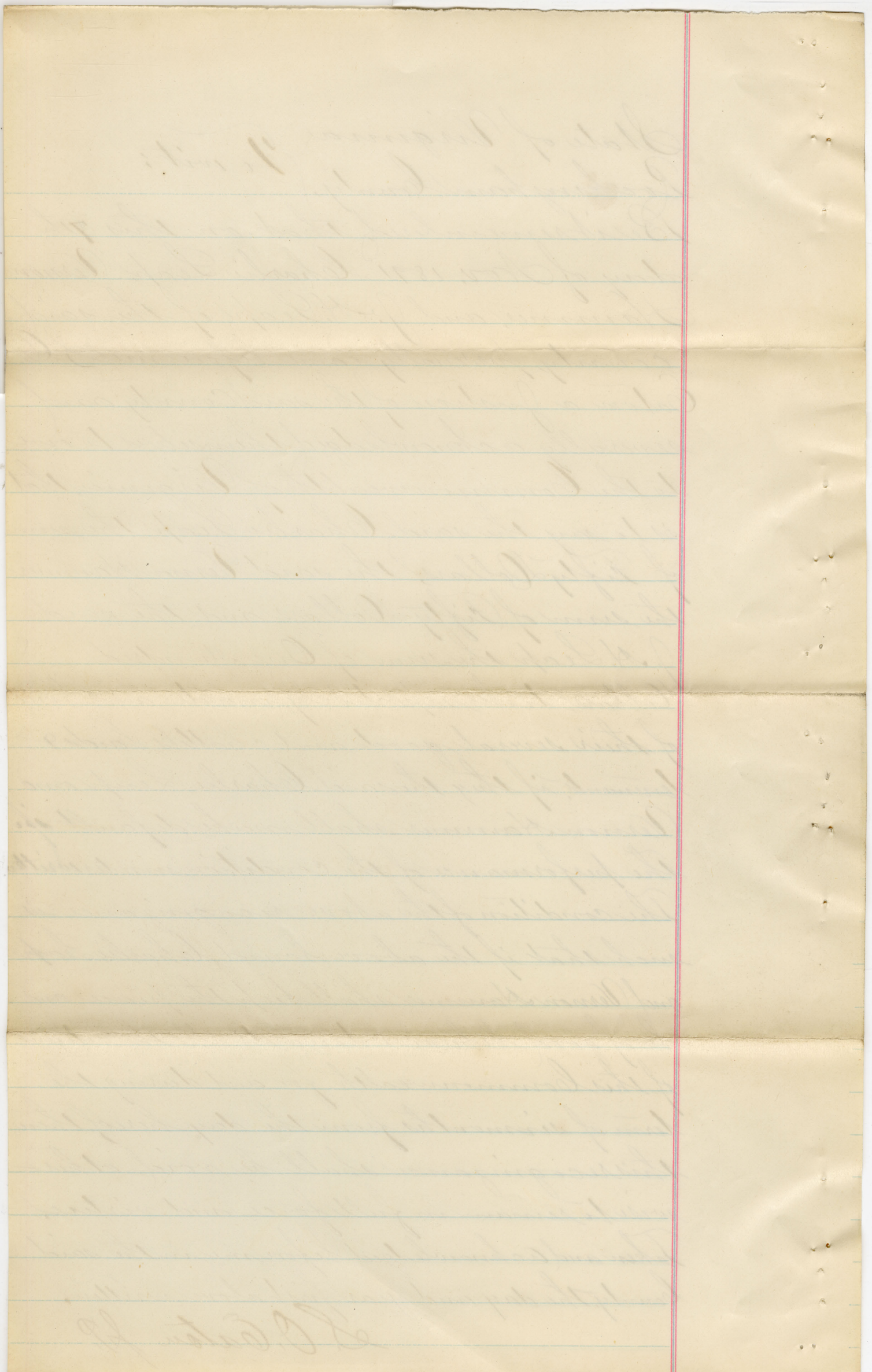

Be it remembered, that on this 7th day of Nov. 1891 Charlie Leap, Vernon Hammer, and J. A. Leap of the said county, personally came before me, S. O. Eaton a Justice of the said County, and severally acknowledged themselves to owe to the Commonwealth of Virginia, that is to say the said Charlie Leap the sum of Fifty Dollars, the said Vernon Hammer the sum of Fifty Dollars and the said J. A. Leap the sum of One Hundred Dollars, to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels, lands & tenements, if they the said Charlie Leap and Vernon Hammer shall make default in the performance of the condition underwritten. The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound Charlie Leap and Vernon Hammer shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth for and during the term of six months from the day hereof, then this recognizance shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue. Taken and acknowledged before me in the said County, the day and year first above written.

Meeting. These are therefore in
the name of the Commonwealth
to Command you to forthwith to
apprehend and bring before me or
some other Justice of said County
the bodies of the said Charlie Leap
& Vernon & Bernard Hammer to
answer the said Complaint and to
be further dealt with according to law
