In the County Court of the said County -

The Jurors of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in and for the body of the County of Rockingham and now attending the said Court - Upon their oath present - that Mary Jane Banghur on the 13th day of March in the year 1894 in the said County, did unlawfully aid in concealing one pair of Wagon harness of the value of five dollars, one Horse collar of the value of one dollar and one bridle of the value of one dollar of the goods and chattels of James H. Drummond, then before - to wit on the 6th day of August 1893 - from the said James H. Drummond, having been feloniously stolen taken and carried away, - she the said Mary Jane Banghur then and there, at the time she so aided in concealing as aforesaid, the property aforesaid, knowing the said property to have been ^{feloniously} stolen, taken and carried away against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia - And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oath aforesaid do further present that Mary Jane Banghur on the 13th day of March in the year 1894 in the said County did unlawfully aid in concealing one pair of Wagon harness of the value of five dollars, one Horse collar of the value of one dollar and one bridle of the value of one dollar of the goods and chattels of James H. Drummond, which Thomas Banghur, Wesley Banghur and William Banghur had before - to wit the 6th day of August 1893 in the said County, feloniously stolen taken and carried away from the said James H. Drummond - she the said
