

STATE OF VIRGINIA—Town of Harrisonburg, to-wit:

TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE OR ANY POLICEMAN OF SAID TOWN.

Whereas Lincy Taylor of the said town, has this day made complaint

and information on oath before me, D. M. SWITZER, MAYOR OF SAID TOWN, that David Condon  
of said town, on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of February 1895

in said town, did a certain dwelling house the property of said Linsey Taylor then situate in the night time of said day - feloniously and burglariously did break and enter with intent to commit larceny and one quilt of the value of five dollars of the goods + chattels of said Linsey Taylor in the said dwelling house being found feloniously and burglariously  
did steal, take and carry away

These are, therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to apprehend  
and bring before me, or some other Justice, the body of said David Condon  
to answer the said complaint, and to be further dealt with according to law. Given under my hand and seal
