To R. L. Smith, a Constable of said County:

WHEREAS, A. L. Anderson of the said county, has this day made complaint and information on oath before me, Chas. E. Lloyd a Justice of the said county, that

Geo. A. Michael of the said county, on the 27th day of July 1907, in the said county, did

unlawfully assault the said A. L. Anderson by using abusive and threatening language and declared that he would get said Anderson and further that on the 7th day of Aug 1907 repeat the said offense by using violent and abusive language tending to a breach of the peace & did also assault said Anderson by pushing & attempting to stop said Anderson from passing him.

These are therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to apprehend and bring before me, or some other Justice of the said County, the body of the said

Geo. A. Michael to answer the said complaint, and to be farther dealt with according to law. And you are required to summon S. P. Cuff, P. V. Wheeler, J. W. Javins, William Shank & Harry Harden

to appear and give evidence in behalf of the Commonwealth, on the examination touching the said offence.

Be it remembered, that on this 8 Day of November 1901 Geo. A. Michael and Mary Michael of said county, personally came before me Charles E. Floyd a justice for said county, and severally acknowledged themselves to owe the commonwealth of Virginia, the said Geo. A. Michael the sum one hundred dollars, and the said Mary Michael the sum of one hundred dollars, of their respective good and chattels, lands and tenements, to be levied, and for the use of the commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition, that if the said Geo. A. Michael shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all persons of this commonwealth, and especially towards A. G. Anderson for the term of twelve months from the date hereof, then this recognizance shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue. Taken and acknowledged before me, in said county, the day and year first above written.
