

BE IN REMEMBERED.

That on the 1st day of January, 1902, S. A. Davis was brought before me, O. B. Roller, Mayor of the town of Harrisonburg, and ex officio a Justice of the Peace for Rockingham County, charged with a misdemeanor, in this, that said S. A. Davis, of said County, upon the 25th day of December, 1901, in said town, in said County, did unlawfully sell by retail, to one Samuel C. Kniceley, in or near the alley between the drug store of L. B. Smootz and the barber shop of Ball & Hedges, in said town, in said County, wines, ardent spirits, malt liquors or mixtures thereof, without first obtaining a license therefor from the State of Virginia, so to do, and is, by me, upon the evidence on oath of Samuel C. Kniceley and Horace Plant, found guilty of said offence, wherefore I adjudged that he pay a fine of forty (\$40.00) dollars, and \$_____ costs, and that he be confined in the Jail of Rockingham County for ~~xxxxx~~ the term of thirty days.

And the said S. A. Davis having prayed an appeal from my said judgment, and appeal ~~is~~ granted him to the next term of the County Court of Rockingham County, and the said judgment and conviction, as well as the said appeal I hereby certify to the said Court.



BE IN REMEMBRANCE.

That on the 1st day of January, 1802, S. A. Davis was
brought before me, O. B. Rollier, Mayor of the town of Harrisonburg,
and on oath he testified that he was for Rockingham County, Virginia,
with a residence in this, that said S. A. Davis, of said County,
upon the 25th day of December, 1801, in said town, in said County,
did unlawfully sell by retail, to one Samuel C. Kniskern, in or near
the place between the drug store of L. B. Shoos and the barber shop
of Hall & Hedger, in said town, in said County, wines, brandy, spirits,
and liquors of various kinds, without first obtaining a license
therefor from the State of Virginia, so to do, and he, by me, upon
the evidence on oath of Samuel C. Kniskern and others, found
guilty of said offense, wherefore I adjudged that he pay a fine of
twenty (\$20.00) dollars, and costs, and that he be confined
in the Jail and Jailhouse of said County for six months, or until he
pay the same.

And the said S. A. Davis having waived an appeal from my
said judgment, and appeal is granted him to the next term of the
County Court of Rockingham County, and the said judgment and con-
fines, as well as the said appeal I hereby certify to the said Court.

BE IT REMEMBERED.

That on the first day of January, 1902, S. A. Davis and Walter Capehart, personally appeared before me, O. B. Roller, Mayor of the town of Harrisonburg, and ex officio a Justice of the Peace for Rockingham County, and severally acknowledged themselves to owe the Commonwealth of Virginia, as follows, that is to say, the said S. A. Davis the sum of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars, and the said Walter Capehart the sum of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars, of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements, to be levied and for the use of the Commonwealth rendered, and waiving their homestead exemption.

YET UPON THIS CONDITION, that whereas, the said S. A. Davis was this day tried before me, O. B. Roller, Mayor of said town, and ex officio a Justice of the Peace for Rockingham County, for a misdemeanor, in this, that he, the said S. A. Davis, of said County, upon the 25th day of December, 1901, in said town in said County, did unlawfully sell by retail, to one Samuel C. Kniceley, in or near the alley between the drug store of E. B. Smootz and the barber shop of Ball & Hedges, in said town, in said County, wines, ardent spirits, malt liquors, or mixtures thereof, without first obtaining a license therefore from the State of Virginia, so to do, and by me adjudged to pay a fine of forty (\$40.00) dollars, and \$ _____ costs, and that he be confined in the Jail of Rockingham County, for the term of thirty days, from which said judgment and conviction the said S. A. Davis took an appeal to the next term of the County Court.

NOW, if the said S. A. Davis shall personally appear before the said County Court on the first day of the next term, (1902 thereof) and answer the Commonwealth for and concerning the said offence

whereof he has been found guilty by me, and shall not thence depart without leave of the said Court, then this recognizance shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
