Yet upon condition that if the said Joseph Jackson, shall for the term of twelve months from the date hereof, be of good behavior towards the Commonwealth and all persons therein, and especially in respect to procuring directly or indirectly from any merchant, keeper of an inn, ordinary, bar-room or distillery, or any other person dealing in intoxicating liquors any spirituous or intoxicating or malt liquors to be sold, bartered, given or furnished to any minor or student, and deliver

or cause to be delivered the same to any
minor or student. Then this recognizance
shall be void, otherwise to remain in
full force and virtue.


