To C. L. Nensel, a Constable of said County:

WHEREAS, Solomon J. Nensley of the said county, has this day made complaint and information on oath before me, J. H. Shipp a Justice of the said county, that

A. S. Long  
of the said county, on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1904, in the said county, did unlawfully, but not feloniously break down  
tear away and injure a certain fence then and there  
enclosing a certain piece of land and by leaving down  
said fence the cattle of the said Solomon J. Nensley  
escaped from his pasture field to the public road and  
said pasture field was thereby exposed to cattle from said road

These are therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, to command you forthwith to apprehend  
and bring before me, or some other Justice of the said County, the body of the said
