

County Court of Rockingham November term 1858

George W Mullen who stands charged with a felony by him committed in this, that he did on the 26th day of August 1858 in the County of Rockingham feloniously steal, take and carry away a quantity of Carpenters & Joiners tools, the goods and chattels of Emmanuel Royer & John Holcomb, was this day led to the bar in custody of the Sheriff, and thereupon sundry witnesses being sworn and examined touching the premises, the court upon mature deliberation, are of opinion that no felony has been committed, as charged, but that a misdemeanor has been committed in the stealing of the Carpenters & Joiners tools, the goods and chattels of Emmanuel Royer, and that there is probable cause to charge the prisoner therewith. He is therefore remanded to answer an indictment to be preferred against him at the February term next of this Court for the offense aforesaid, and the prisoner was remanded.
